Jacoba's jottings... an article in the Weekly Connection (October 22, 2017) from the Illinois South Conference by Rev. Shana Johnson has added some levity to the church office in the last week. Shana had heard an NPR 'throwback" podcast entitled "Can You Tell Your Life Story in Exactly Six Words?" We have been playing with how we would describe our lives in six words. A few of the quotes below are ours; some come from the NPR Show. How would you describe your life in six words, not more – not less? We were amazed at how quickly the six words came to us.

I picked passion. Now I'm poor. I am blessed by my children. I still make coffee for two. A thorn in everyone's side Living alone, loving cats, growing flowers. Not quite what I was planning. Servng God as a UCC pastor.

Five years ago, I was assigned to put my theology in six words; not more, not less. I came up with *"God's love for us never ends,"* As you know, that has become my mantra. Could you say what you believe in six words – not more – not less?

Pastor Shana went on to write, "The idea of six words is to think clearly and succinctly, how you might write about your life's story. As I considered this creative writing prompt, I thought about how interesting it would be to apply it to a local church. What six words we would use to tell our church's story could be very revealing. What might these six words reveal about our mission? Our beliefs? Our commitments? Our joys? Our struggles? Our victories? Most importantly, what might those words reveal about our faith?"

I have wondered what we might say in six words about UCC, Neillsville. We each have our own understanding who/what UCC is for us. What are the six words that describe UCC for you? Or maybe what are the six words you wish described UCC? I have played around with some phrases and I will share them with you, but first I want to hear your words.
