Jacoba's jottings.... Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year. The 2018 UCC Still-Speaking Devotions for Lent is called Lovers and Fools – as Easter falls on April Fool's Day. I have wondered how we might be lovers – maybe even fools in the church. Our Church is very good at offering care and compassion in the community. Recently, though I have noticed we are stepping away from ministry in the church. We work very well together when our ministry is outward focused – but we have lost focus for some of the things that need to happen within the church. It has been difficult to find times to meet as Committees; church/committee leaders are having to do more than their share and are burning out. Our efforts to be together and/or reach out to one another has lessened.



I wonder if this Lent we might choose to act our love for the church and one another as our Lenten Discipline. Here are some ideas that come to my mind – please add your own. Take on these opportunities once, weekly or daily this Lent.

- † Visit a shut-in (ask me for names)
- † Attend the meeting of your committee
- † Serve a coffee hour with healthy options
- † Offer to chair a Fund Raiser
- † Come to the Sun-Catchers or 2nd Half
- † Ask Jim Vradenburg or the Trustees what needs to be done for our building
- † Send cards to members
- † Make a meal for one we pray for in worship (check on their dietary restrictions)
- † Serve as an usher, greeter, acolyte, Scripture reader
- † Help with clean-up after the Lenten Soup Suppers
- † Come to the Midweek worship services
- † Sing in the choir – offer special music for the Lenten Service
- † Go with me to the Neillsville Retirement Community as I offer Communion
- † Go with me to Care and Rehab when I lead their worship service.
- † Offer to teach/lead music) one of our two Sunday School classes (For Lent or for a week)
- † Offer to sit with a child in worship
- † Offer a ride to someone so they can go to church
- † Offer assistance to someone who needs an arm to get to their car in the parking lot
- † Sit with or talk to someone before/after worship, you don't know so well.

In our thirteenth year, this project served 297 children of 102 families! We were able to provide winter clothing, boots, food, and other needed items because of your gracious contribution.

Volunteers begin shopping in January to find the best bargains allowing us to provide warm winter clothing for children the following Christmas. Volunteers knit, crochet, quilt, and make stuffed bears (often, using items donated by local businesses and individuals) throughout the entire year in anticipation of providing homemade items to needy children.

THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS
Donors are contacted in the fall with requests for contributions. Local merchants are contacted for prices for large quantities of items.

THANK YOU DONORS AND LOCAL MERCHANTS

Families are referred from Clark County Social Services, local schools, food pantries and churches. Social workers graciously assist us, going above and beyond their everyday jobs to help us.

THANK YOU SOCIAL SERVICES
Tags, each representing a child, are placed on Christmas trees in the community. Community members choose names from the trees and purchase gift items for each child. Employee groups of local businesses also contact us to obtain tags for children for whom they purchase gifts. Volunteers transport the gifts to the United Church of Christ. These gifts are wrapped by volunteers individuals

and community groups and sorted into boxes designated for each family. Each family receives several bags of groceries, including non-perishable items plus milk, ham, cheese and bread. Delivery of gifts and food to each family is done by volunteers, generally by one adult and often one to three accompanying teenagers. Volunteers, local businesses, and service organizations provide wonderful meals to feed our “volunteer workforce.”

This is a wonderful project that benefits needy children and families in our local communities. We often accept late applications (some as late as December 23rd!) and strive to meet the needs of any family in need and making a request. The delivery people are rewarded with big smiles from children who are excited about something as simple as cheese or their favorite cereal! We thank the United Church of Christ for so generously allowing us to utilize their space for nearly an entire month. Thank you for your part in making this project a success!
