Jesus says,

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ... I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." John 15:7,11

Jacoba's jottings... Praying for others is right and good. Jesus also lets us know that we can pray for ourselves too. Yet, many of us have told ourselves we ought not to pray for our own needs; we believe others have greater concerns. Some of us may not even know how or what to ask for ourselves. So, this month, I ask you, what do you want God to do for you? Not what do you want for your family or your friends or for the world. I am asking what do YOU want from God for YOU? What is your deepest prayer for yourself – just for you. It took me a bit to figure out the answer to that question for myself. But once the answer came to me, I knew this is really what I want.



Once we realize what we want, Jesus encourages us to ask. Ask in his name. Ask and we will receive. We know Jesus is true to his word. We also know that what we ask for needs to be in line with his teachings. If we ask him for revenge against someone who has hurt us, we will not likely receive the answer we want. However, Jesus might help us change our perspective which in turn could change a challenging relationship. Asking him to bless us while denying those same blessings to others will not likely be granted. However, Jesus might open our eyes as to how we can mutually bless one another. If we ask for good health, we might have physical health in mind, however God's response to us may have more to do with mental or spiritual healing. While Jesus promises to do for us what we wish, God is still free to do what God wants to do. We may not want to hear God's answers, we may not want to respond to the Holy Spirit's guidance – but have no doubt God will take seriously our prayers. Of course, God's answer to our prayers will not just be for us. When God answers

prayers, God will intend for others also to know joy, peace, hope, love, faith. God's answers our wants and needs will make the love of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit evident in the world. God wants joy for you and me and joy for the world. Do not hesitate to ask God for what you want. Let God surprise you. And then watch how God's answer to you touches the lives of others as well.

Prayer: Surprising God, hear our prayers for what we want; Help us to use your responses to create joy not only in our lives but also in the world. Amen.

The Lamplight Concert is designed with the idea of helping congregations to raise money for the homeless. The songs in the concert were selected with the theme of the love and comforts of home, both to entertain and inspire the audience. The Lamplight Concert was performed by Kate Jennings, vocal and Judith Permann, piano. They come from the United Church of Christ located in River Falls,

Wi. The concert blended voice, piano, musical styles, and the love of home. While enjoying the performance, the audience hopefully thought gratefully of their own homes and gave generously to those who don't have a home of their own. It worked, we raised \$1200 for the House of Mercy. The concert was sponsored by Neillsville United Church of Christ. Thrivent Financial donated seed money to cover advertising, gas money for the musicians and tuning of the piano.

The House of Mercy is a home to Clark County families of women and children who would otherwise be homeless, and it relies on continued generosity from Clark County to continue its mission of alleviating poverty and strengthening families. > Do Justice - Love Kindness - Walk Humbly Shift: Our Unfolding Story 55th Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting

Wisconsin Conference UCC was held June 9-11 at Green Lake Conference Center. I represented our church as a delegate. This year's Annual Meeting continued to explore how we are SHIFTING from maintenance to mission. The conference attendees learned about new opportunities and new resources for growth and change in our congregations. Inspiring stories of faithful witness and ministry in the Wisconsin Conference were shared.

A new addition to Annual was the Share Fair. 21 Wisconsin congregations exhibited their inspiring stories of ministry. Attendees could talk with the people involved in innovative Ministries and learn how they got started, challenges they faced, where they found resources, what results they're seeing, and more. It was fun to gather fresh ideas for new ministries to bring back to our congregations. Connecting with folks to lend their experience is a good way for a congregation to take on a new initiative. I talked with Calvary UCC & Wilmot UMC Twin Lakes about their Angels Blankets of Caring ministry, Memorial UCC Fitchburg about their Dr. Who & Theology, First Congregational Genoa City- Free Community Meal, First Congregational UCC Waukesha - KickStart Cooking for kids and First Congregational UCC River Falls- Resource for biblical literacy.



I coordinated an informational / resource table for Lay Academy at the share fair. It was fun to have my Lay Academy colleagues share time working at the table.

My year 3 Lay Academy class received certificates for completion of 3 years of study. We were presented at the Saturday evening gathering. I will be continuing with year 4 in September. Thank

A resolution to become an Immigrant Welcoming Conference was introduced at the 2016 Annual Meeting. The vote to begin a year of study on this topic passed with strong support at the 2016 Annual meeting. 70 congregations were engaged in study throughout the year. The vote to formally adopt the resolution passed at 2017 Annual Meeting. The Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ declares itself an "Immigrant Welcoming Conference" and that it encourages the development of policies dedicated to facilitating the respectful welcome and inclusion of all immigrants in Wisconsin.

We had inspiring new worship experiences this year. The Many is an indie folk/ gospel, liturgically- grounded, new kind of worship band. Gary Rand, Director Worship activities and professor of worship at McCormick Theological Seminary engaged us in worship through music and activities. Just a few of our worship leaders! Worship art by our conference art team was so creative and breath taking.

Thank you for sending me to Annual Meeting to represent our church. I always enjoy seeing friends and forming new friendships.

Pastor Jacoba's Reflections on the Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting 2017

I very enjoyed the speakers this year again. The Rev. Dr. John Dorhauer, President and General Minister of our Denomination brought a message of hope. John was my Association Minister when I was a pastor in St. Louis. Filled with compassion, John leads our denomination demanding justice for all who endure injustice. He reminds us to be the church God has called us to be – a church welcoming and affirming of all. John spoke of our white privilege and our need to address the injustice our privilege continues to cause to people of color. While many lament declining attendance and financial resources, Dorhauer reminded us of the particular ministry at the heart of who the UCC is. He encouraged to follow the lead of the Holy Spirit and to live into the hope of the gospel.

The Saturday morning speaker was Rev. Everett Mitchell, pastor of Christ the Solid Rock Baptist Church and Dane County Circuit Court Judge. He was very engaging, speaking to us of race relations, telling stories from his work as a Circuit Court Judge and pastor. He encourages us to get to know people who are different from us. I am ready to take a group down to worship at his church in Madison!

Our Conference Minister, Rev. Franz Rigert also spoke twice. He spoke of his recent trip to the Middle East (with John Dorhauer) and he also encouraged to seek the Holy Spirit's guidance. He reminded us to wait for the Spirit's leading as we move forward with hope.

I am told that the addresses by our speakers will be on line at wcucc.org in the near future.

I also want to thank Betty Opelt, Joy and Don Abel, Jim Sjolin and Donita Follen for together leading worship in my absence. Those who were present on the 11th heard a sermon very similar to the one we heard at the Annual Meeting by Franz Rigert. I have been attending Annual Conference Meetings for nearly forty years. I enjoy them and thank you for making it possible for me to attend.

In addition, I want to make you aware that the General Synod of the UCC takes place in Baltimore on June 30-July 4. Plenary sessions will be live-streamed on UCC.org.
