"Called as Partners in Christ's Service"

Jacoba's jottings... Church and community partnership has been on my mind this summer. Father Steve Bryce, along with pastors from the ELCA, the United Methodist Church and the UCC worked together to put together a service of worship for the House of Mercy celebration. While we were doing that, another group was putting together the meal under Bonnie Weyer's direction, others were fund raising and others were doing decorations, parking, layout of the building at the Connie and Allan Walter family farm. Businesses,



Clark County churches, WEAU, local newspapers, and lots of people worked together to make "Sowing Seeds of Mercy, Hope for the Homeless" Event a success.

Working with partners is among the things we have talked about in our <u>Weird Church: Welcome to the</u> <u>Twenty-first Century</u> book study. Already we are partners with Feed My People, Cummins, Listeman Foundation, Neillsville Public Schools and many donors from UCC and community individuals and groups to make the Back-Pack ministry possible. Sending food home with school children every other weekend would not happen without our partners.

Another thing that came up in our discussions was having neighborhood block parties. Many of us don't know our neighbors. We are also unaware of the needs of our neighbors, neighborhoods and community. Is there a neighbor who needs someone to notice if a light goes on or off in the living room, making sure that that person is still doing ok? Is there a safety concern in the neighborhood? Are there common concerns- speeding down the street, wondering if a neighbor is involved in drugs? Does someone need yard work done? Do other neighbors know who can be hired in the area?

The connection between my thoughts in this issue of *Jottings*, is are there areas where UCC can be a partner in our community? Block parties, conversations with our neighbors can make us aware of the needs and gifts of our community and then we can begin to find partners to respond to what our neighbors need.

The question of how to reach out to share God's love with our neighbors can only be answered by knowing the needs and resources of our community. Are you willing to host a block party – to get to know your neighbors and ask what needs they notice in our community? If the church is to continue responding to the needs of this community –and UCC with the help of many partners does that well, we need to know what the needs are and what we can do together to make a difference. Fifty-eight families have asked for help since November of 2016 because they are homeless in Clark County. Who knew? To what other needs does UCC with partners have the ability to respond? Block parties are one way to learn those needs and the willingness of our neighbors to work together. Our Book Study Conversation suggested the Clark County Health Department's survey done in 2014 as another resource.

Jesus sends his disciples out to do mission – heal the sick, raise the dead, throw out demons; his expectation is that his disciples will feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, and visit the sick and imprisoned. We need to listen for the Holy Spirit's guidance as to the ministries we are called to do and then find our partners so we can follow Jesus' ways.


