Jacoba's jottings.... The Lectionary Text suggested for Ash Wednesday is always Matthew 6:1-21 which is about prayer and how to pray. In the season of Lent we are encouraged to pray. Among other things in that reading (which includes the Lord's Prayer), Jesus encourages us "Whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret and your Father who sees in secret will reward you," (Matthew 6:6). Quiet, personal prayer supports us in life, strengthens our



relationship with God, gives us the opportunity to lift up in prayer those in need, and gives the Holy Spirit an opening into our lives to guide us. Jesus often left his disciples, so he could have some alone time to pray. I know when I am disciplined about my prayer life, I am more faithful, less anxious, more aware, more connected with God and to others. The ways I pray are varied- sometimes only a quick thought, at times led by a scripture reading or other writing, sometimes meditation, sometimes lifting up particular people or events. Yet, to sit quietly or even speaking or weeping in prayer is not enough. Prayer is not an end but a means toward living out our faith.

After a time alone, Jesus returned to his ministry. He called and supported his disciples, he healed the sick; he allowed his arrest. The author of the book of James wrote faith without works is dead. I would say, prayer which does not lead to works or action is incomplete. Prayers often ask God to act and Jesus says whatever we ask in his name, he will do it (John 14:14). Prayers also give the Holy Spirt our permission to lead us, so we act or enact what God calls us to do. Our prayers often guide us to "follow up" on what we lift up to God.



May this season of Lent be a time of prayer and action- pray for the sick – and call them or send a card or bring them something they need. Pray for the grieving and encourage them with your faith. Pray for the hungry and donate to the food pantry. Pray for victims and take their words and needs seriously (believe them) send money or write letters to those in power or work for change so they are no longer victimized. Pray for those who need housing, a job, hope and help them find what they need.

"Not my will, but thy will done" Jesus's prayer in Gethsemane, is the perfect prayer which is always answered. It asks God to act, it also invites God to lead us to do what God calls us to do.
