Jacoba's jottings.... Years ago, I celebrated Easter on Ash Wednesday. I can still tell you where I was sitting and how it struck me. On that day, I knew new life not the death the ashes proclaim; I knew the joy of being in the Savior's presence. I knew God had new things in store for me. After a time of struggle, something clicked on Ash Wednesday for me and I could sing, with gusto, "Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia! Following our exalted head, Alleluia." The season of Lent was very different that year for me than what we usually experience.

I have also known Good Friday on Mardi Gras. Mardi Gras (Fat Tuesday) is the day before Ash Wednesday. It is the day we use up all the fat in the house and party like there is no tomorrow; games for the children, beads and craziness. But that year, I was filled with grief, and loneliness, feeling abandoned, betrayed and dying. Easter could not come soon enough.

Where are you this season of Lent? Mardi Gras? Ash Wednesday? Palm Sunday? Maundy Thursday? Good Friday? Holy Saturday? Easter? Those days can come at any time in our lives. For me, I think I am more aware of them in Lent as I reflect on the stories of Holy Week.

My mind this year is on the farmers who are struggling with milk prices that are so low that many will not be able to continue as farmers. Their grief, their fear, their despair is being acted out as more farmers than veterans are taking their lives every day. Hearing their experiences, I remember again the year we were told to leave the farm – Maundy Thursday and Good Friday probably came the day in October when the landlord told my parents our contract was up in February. We surely felt betrayed and it sure felt like death rather than life. We had little hope. The day the cows were auctioned and a week later when the U-Haul pulled out with all our earthly belongings was Holy Saturday for me. As I think about it, Easter probably came for me months later, the day we first visited Bethel UCC and knew we had found a new church. Again, I knew hope, joy and peace. My family would likely tell the story differently. Can you tell a story of Lent that happened in your lifetime?

I invite you to consider where you are this Lenten Season. When have you known joy, betrayal, denial, abandonment, dying, and new life? We all experience the ebbs and flows of life – good times, hard times, and again good times; or as Bruegemann names it, Orientation, Disorientation and Reorientation.

Wherever we are, as followers of Jesus, we know Easter comes. New life is promised and will be ours. As God raised Jesus in the tomb, we too shall surely be raised to new life. Wherever you are at this moment, look forward to again singing:

Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia! Following our exalted Head, Alleluia! Made like Him, like Him we rise, Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave the skies! Alleluia!

This area was just newly remodeled and houses homeless mothers and children on a short-term basis. It has three bedrooms with two bathrooms. The kitchen, wash-room, and living room areas are shared by the families.

She wanted to live in Greenwood so her boys could walk to school and be in the same town as their friends. She is working three jobs. One fulltime and two part time jobs and still struggles as she raised her boys. The staff at HoM still mentors her and gives her guidance wherever we can.

Our second Mom ironically is renting in the same building as our first Mom. She now has a safe place to have shared custody of her three children. The children are doing much better since they can have time with Mom. They also go to school in Greenwood. Again, we stay in contact with the family and help where needed.
