Jacoba's jottings... I received a text this morning from a friend, who reminded me that I am daily in his prayers. His message, even at 6:04 am brought a smile to my face – and some clarity about what to write for this issue of Jottings. Carl has often told me he prays for me daily, but I forget that until he tells me again. I appreciate his daily prayers for me and his openness about telling me each time we connect that he still is. Anita L. also tells me she prays for me each Sunday morning before church. I do not receive lightly the prayers of others and hearing that



someone is praying for me is a treasured gift. Is there someone for whom you pray regularly? What causes you to pray for that person or those people – the relationship you have with them or maybe their needs? With Carl, I was among the first on the scene of a car accident that should have killed him. I took seriously his calls for God as others worked to free him from his vehicle and gave him medical treatment. Each time, he called out the name God, I finished his prayer – praying for healing, hope, peace. He continues to be grateful to all of us who helped him survive that morning.

A conversation with another friend this week caused me to consider again what would I name as my favorite text. Luke 23:31-32 is one of my personal favorites.

"Simon, Simon listen! Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat, but I have prayed for you that your own faith may not fail you, when once you have turned back, strengthen your brothers (sisters)."

To know that Jesus prays for Simon and for you and me, gives me comfort, hope, and peace. We are not alone.

Jesus is praying for us that our faith will not fail us – and he knows that at times it will. At times we will have doubts; at times we will stray from our faith; at times like Simon Peter we may even deny Jesus. Yet, even as Jesus knows we will fail, he continues to have faith that in time we will return to our faith – and at that time, he expects that we will be able to strengthen others. Realizing Jesus is praying for me, when I am faithful and when I fail (sin) helps me through and encourages me on my journey. It is good news that Jesus prays for all of us and for our world.

When I teach our confirmands about worship, I often mention the prayer I ask us all to pray before I preach. I smile as several of them can either recite it or say it with me.

"May the words I speak be faithful to the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, and may you hear what the Spirit intends for your ears."

I am not sure when or how it came to be that I pray those words; did I pray them with another colleague who spoke them, or did the Holy Spirit give them to me and then they stayed with me? Today, I do not think about the sermon I am about to preach, but the possibility of those words being a prayer at the beginning of the day or as we encounter one another on the journey.

"May the words we/I speak, be faithful to the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, and may we/I hear what the Spirit intends for our/my ears."

What do you think? How would praying that prayer affect your day and your relationships throughout the day? How would it affect your speaking and your hearing? Might out prayer also affect the speaking and hearing of others?

In any case I am grateful to know Jesus, Carl, and Anita and others – including me- continue to pray for you, me and our world. Ah, the power of prayer –the prayers of Jesus and others for us. and our own prayers for ourselves. Thanks be to God for the gift of prayers prayed for us and by us!

CONFIRMATION BEGINS

Classes begin on September 12 at 3:30pm with a Pool Party at the Moseids. Our class sessions begin September 19. Once again, Don Abel, Larry Marshall and Jim Sjolin will be teaching assistants. I am glad when they notice class members not understanding what I am trying to teach (theology is hard stuff sometimes); then together we try to explain things in another way; it also happens that sometimes the assistants and I have different perspectives; the students benefit as we discuss our differences in class. I am grateful for our teaching assistants! The class and their parents have already shared with me how these students valued quiet prayer walks last year. We will learn a variety of ways of praying as we begin our sessions. Again this year, we will use the re:form curriculum which includes videos and activities which last year led to some powerful discussions.

Class members are expected to attend worship services, participate in mission experiences; the Confirmation Retreat at Pilgrim Center and the Urban Immersion experience in Milwaukee. We hope to have some speakers come to the church to share with us their faith. The Confirmands will also prepare and lead a worship service and write their Statement of Faith.

At this point, the class members, their parents, church members and I are praying about who will be the mentors for our class members this year. Please join us in those prayers and consider saying yes if asked or letting us know you are willing to be a mentor.

Class members, parents and mentors will be introduced to the congregation on September 23 as they sign their covenants.
