Jacoba's jottings... As we look at the November Calendar, we see we will have much "together time." There will be important times for worship and service in the church with our service also reaching beyond the congregation. Let me begin with the fund-raising activities of November 6 and November 10 and November 12-14. On Election Day, we will serve Chili from 11am – 7pm – serving in our Fellowship Hall and offering both carryout and delivery. There will be opportunities to help beginning very early in the morning ... 6 am, throughout the day and of course in the evening for the final cleanup after the serving is complete. Many workers will be appreciated – Sign up to help.

Our Annual Holiday Fair takes place that same week on Saturday, November 10. Again, many helpers are needed – bakers and folks who have already crafted items and gone through their closets for treasures. On the day of the Fair, cooks and sellers are needed to staff the four areas of the Fair – the "Treasures New to You Shop", the "Bake Shop", the "Gift Boutique" and the luncheon.

The Chicken Pot Pie makers will move into the kitchen and fellowship hall on the 12th-14th. They skin chicken, prepare pie crusts, assemble the pies and wrap them up. Come and join them – they finish by 3pm each day.

We do these activities, yes to raise money the church needs to do its ministry. We also do them as opportunities to grow in relationship with one another. We have a number of members who serve in the church on various committees and in groups, and I am grateful for their service – these three events in November though intend to bring together all of us, working together. They all provide time to talk, get to know each other better and to use

the various gifts God has entrusted to us. As we do them together, we trust our relationships are strengthened and God is honored.

Worship in November also offers special opportunities to support one another. On November 4, we will remember church members who have died in the past year, as well the people whose funeral services UCC offered. We have invited their families to join us in worship. All who grieve will be given an opportunity to light a candle. This is again an opportunity to support one another – whether you weep or not – your presence is needed at this service to lift up our faith in God as at least some of us (most of us?) for all who grieve. With all the saints who have died and all who continue as members and friends of UCC our service concludes with coming to the Table of our Lord Jesus Christ who joins us in supporting one another.

This year Veterans Day falls on a Sunday. This afternoon, I meet with Veterans to hear their stories and plan the worship service for the 11th. We will talk about their experiences, from the perspective of their faith. Some will tell their own stories, some I will tell. This year, Neillsville has welcomed home Viet Nam Veterans and honored all Veterans – UCC will culminate those activities with our Worship Service which will acknowledge the strength God gave to those who served our nation. Come to be inspired by their stories and to have your own faith strengthened.

On the 18th, we will give thanks to God, yes, for all things, however particularly this year for all who serve in the ministry of the church. Actually, it is all month that we say thank you to one and for another and to God for the opportunities to serve. May God be glorified.

THE DOCTRINE OF DISCOVERY

The Wisconsin Conference of the UCC has asked congregations to study The Doctrine of Discovery so that next spring we are ready to vote as to whether we believe this doctrine should be repudiated (announced as invalid). I have heard several say, they do not know what all this means. Let me try to explain.

When the explorers of the 1400's (Columbus and others) set out to explore the world, the Pope decreed in the Doctrine of Discovery, that if they found any inhabitants on the land across the ocean, they were to force them to become Christians and if the inhabitants refused, then they should be enslaved or killed, and their land taken from them. That Decree was the basis of Treaties and laws in the US which forced indigenous people to move from one place to another as the Europeans took over the land where the Indians first lived. That Decree by the Pope in the 1400's and the treaties and laws based on it continue to be among the laws still used by US courts to make their decisions concerning Indian Affairs and Lands.

Christians over the years have caused the Indians, (and Hawaiians, Alaskan Natives) to lose their land, culture, traditions and language. What we did can never be made right; however, to acknowledge that what our ancestors did was wrong may help improve relationships between us.

In my conversations with social workers working for the Ho-Cak People in Black River Falls (BRF) and now in conversations with members of the Ho-Cak UCC Church in BRF, I am learning there are mixed feelings about the Indian School here in Neillsville. Some of the Indians are very angry at having been taken from their families, made to speak English and let go of their tribal customs and faith; others appreciate the education they received and the love that was expressed to them through Rev. Stucki and school staff.

The Wisconsin Conference is asking UCC Churches to seriously consider our responsibility and how The Doctrine of Discovery continues to affect the Tribes. Studies guides are available; Tribe members are willing to come to speak with us. You can contact me if you are interested in reading the study or having a conversation.

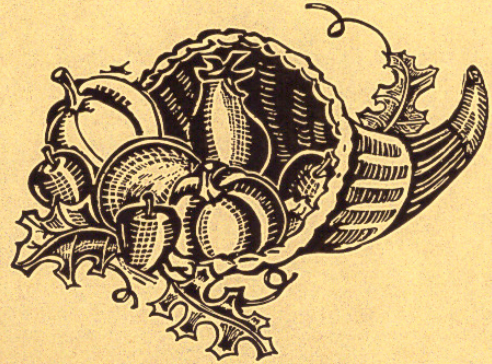

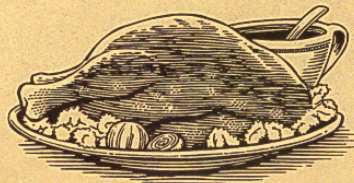
