*"The things announced in the past—look— they have already happened, but I'm declaring new things.
Before they even appear, I tell you about them." Isaiah 41:9*

Jacoba's jottings... Two things catch me as I read this text: the past has happened and is done; God intends to do new things and tell us about these new things on the horizon.

It is easy to hold onto the past. The glory days. Hurts, angers and sadness that broke our hearts. Fears that linger long after danger has passed. Honors once achieved. Mistakes made long ago. A self-portrait of what was, hoping it will be again. Good times. Hard times. Sins committed. Debts owed. Loving relationships.

The past – good and hard memories, filled with joy and sadness, anger, fear and love experienced or rejected rolling in our heads filling or breaking our hearts can so overwhelm us that we miss the present moment.

God has new things in mind for us—for each of us, for our world. There is new joy, new beauty, new wholeness to experience. It is not that bad things won't happen, yet even as they do, God is recreating hope and healing, restoring life. Things that were, are not the same. Isaiah asks, "do you not perceive it?"

To perceive what God is doing in the world, open eyes, ears, hearts are needed. God intends to inform us about what God is doing, even before the newness comes into being.

And, yes, not only is it our choice as to whether or not we will recognize what God is doing, it is also our choice as to how we will receive what God is doing in our lives and in the world. God is always hoping that we too will choose to work toward bringing God's hope, peace, justice, joy and love into the world. Again, our response to what God does remains our choice. Yet as self-proclaimed followers of Jesus to love God with all our heart, soul and mind and our neighbors as ourselves is what we will choose to do. When we keep those two commandments, we fulfil what it means to love God and follow Jesus.

It is a New Year! Let go of the past – and remain in the present. May we receive and rejoice in the new things God offers to us and our world.

Worship in January

January 6 – Epiphany – the day when we celebrate the coming of the Wise Men to worship the newborn King. Matthew 2:1-12 is the text. Learning from Outsiders will be the focus. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be served at the altar.

January 13 – Baptism of Jesus – We will renew our commitment to our baptismal vows – again proclaiming what we believe and our relationship to God in Jesus Christ.

January 20 – Our Associate Conference Minister, the Rev. Rob MacDougall will preach this Sunday. Conference Staff often say, invite us to come and be with you. We finally found a date that works. At this moment, he is considering talking about "The Why."

January 27– Annual Congregational Meeting follows the Worship Service. I Corinthians 12:12-31a will be our text – congregational relationships will be our focus.
