Jacoba's jottings... UCC you are amazing! And you are surely competitive and caring. What fun it was to gather the soup for our local food pantries. I enjoyed watching how you supported each other – reminders in the grocery store as you met each other in aisles – "soup is on sale and with your senior discount you can get even more cans;" you shopped for those who could



not shop; when the polar vortex passed by leaving icy roads and parking lots you picked up soup cans from those who could not get their purchases to the church. From the sidelines I watched how you cared for one another as you worked together toward a goal. I watched the cans multiply. Pick-up trucks backed up to the doors and cars were left running (didn't want to risk them

not starting again) as members ran in with their contributions. Jesus was surely watching – much as I imagine him watching as the 5000 were fed. He surely blessed our endeavors to feed the hungry as we encouraged one another to be generous.

The competition with the other three churches, but particularly with Calvary added to our



motivation. We wondered, how are they doing? Do we have any reason to stop in their building giving us a chance to peak at their stash? Friends among our two churches teased each other. I know the Apostle Paul wrote in I Corinthians 13, love is not arrogant; it is not boastful...however we also need to celebrate a little. **We collected 841 cans; Calvary 761 and with Hillside and Living Hope the total soup cans collected was 1978!** I could not have imagined! We cannot get too smug – the difference was only 80 cans. (smile). Already I heard someone say today they were going to watch for soup sales; I reminded them to watch the

expiration dates. But yes, game on for 2020!

All those cans had to be delivered – great ministry for our seven CD's. they packed them up and took a third to the Office of Aging where Mary Sladich told then about people who were indeed hungry and would very much appreciate the soup. And they took a third to "Grandma's Panty', the Clark County Food Pantry of 5th St. Our generosity provided an opportunity for our sixth and seventh graders to offer their time and abilities and to have their eyes opened to folks who could use a hand-up.



Yes, UCC once again, you are amazing in your care for one another, our community and the joy we experience in working with our neighboring churches to address a community need. We may again be the Souper Bowl Challenge winners; but let's not deny we are Super. *Jacoba's 2nd page.....*I received an email from the hospital saying all staff and volunteers (I am a volunteer chaplain) who have not been vaccinated against the flu, must wear a mask at all times; others are encouraged to wear masks. I choose to be vaccinated and have been yearly since the early 1990's. I take seriously that at any time I may be called on to visit someone whose health is fragile. And yes, today, since I have a cold, you may find me wearing a mask to protect you.

Jim Vradenburg and I want to say thank you to Kevin, Luke, Logan and Bryce and their friends who have cleared the snow from near the church (and tonight my driveway). The teens have also been helping others in town who are not as able to clear their own drives and sidewalks. I want to give a shout out to all our folks who see a need and offer their help.

Lent 2019

Wednesday Evening services begin on Ash Wednesday, March 6 at Calvary with Soup Supper at 6 and the worship service at 7pm. I have been taking an on-line class called "ReBoot Your Worship". The class intends to help pastors preach a series of services based on a theme. The theme I have chosen for Sunday mornings in Lent is from Isaiah 55:6 "Seek the Lord while God may be found; call upon the Lord while God is near." I have been working with the confirmands on that theme – asking them to help me think about it and creating a visual focal point – something ordinary that will help us remember the theme when we are out and about throughout the week. I am hoping our carpenter skilled and creative confirmation class might build us something.

This is a new way for me to put together worship services – we will have a theme song each week and will return to the theme throughout the services of Lent. Plan now to join us.

CHRISTMAS ANGEL PROJECT 2018 Neillsville/Granton/Chili/Humbird 100% volunteer organization

In our fourteenth year, this project served 291 children of 102 families! We were able to provide winter clothing, boots, food, and other needed items because of your gracious contribution.

Volunteers begin shopping in January to find the best bargains allowing us to provide warm winter clothing for children the following Christmas. Volunteers knit, crochet, quilt, and make stuffed bears (often, using items donated by local businesses and individuals) throughout the entire year in anticipation of providing homemade items to needy children.

THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS We contact donors in the fall with requests for contributions. Local merchants are contacted for prices for large quantities of items.

Families are referred from Social Services, local school, food pantries and churches.

THANK YOU TO ALL THOSE WHO REFER FAMILIES IN NEED

Tags, each representing a child, are placed on Christmas trees in the community. Community

members choose names from the trees and purchase gift items for each child. Employee groups of local businesses also contact us to obtain tags for children for whom they purchase gifts.

Volunteers transport the gifts to the United Church of Christ. These gifts are wrapped by volunteer individuals and community groups and sorted into boxes designated for each family. Each family receives several bags of groceries, including non-perishable items plus milk, ham, cheese, and bread. Delivery of gifts and food to

each family is done by volunteers, generally by one adult and often one to three accompanying teenagers. Volunteers, local businesses, and service organizations provide wonderful meals to feed our "volunteer workforce."

This is a wonderful project that benefits needy children and families in our local communities. We often accept late applications (some as late as December 23rd!) and strive to meet the needs of any family in need and making a request.
