Jacoba's jottings... Years ago, several of us heard a speaker who every few sentences used the word edify in one way or another. It became rather humorous. We enjoyed giving each other the look, each time we heard it again, sometimes even rolling our eyes. I am not sure she intentionally used the word edify that often; however, I have been intentionally using the same theme, songs, words, ideas in this season of Lent. And I hope you have caught on. I hope you have even thought, well she said it again "Seek the Lord, while God may be found; Call on the Lord while God is near."

My intent is that the hunting blind and mini bed in the sanctuary has caused you to think about where and when you see God and hear God in the places where you are. Where do you seek God and where do you call on God's name? Are you in some way living as an individual who is a seeker of God's heart?



Of course, prayer is one way to seek God's heart. As we ask for health, or a new job, or a way to manage a difficult situation, we could ask what God desires for us. Another way to seek God's heart is to read the scriptures and see what the Still-Speaking God is saying to us through them. I like the Psalms – however this month, I have been reading portions of Luke for my personal devotions. Yet another way to seek the Lord and God's heart is by serving and supporting those who are the least of these in our world – remembering Jesus said, "as you do it to the least of these, you do it to me." Of course, as a pastor, I hope we who gather in worship are seeking God's heart. We can seek God and be seekers of God's heart in a variety of ways. If you are unsure how God wants your relationship to grow, pray – ask God. God will make it clear to you what God wants for you and from you.

On the day of his resurrection, Jesus asked Mary in the garden, whom do you seek? Jesus knew Mary was seeking for his body. For what are you seeking? For whom are you seeking? To whom do you call? For what do you call? Maybe as we move closer to Easter you could take some time reflect on what, how, why, when and where you seeking and what you hope to find.

Prayer: Seeker of our hearts, the One who call us by name, help us to seek you, know you, love you, serve you.
