Jacoba's jottings... We are hosting *Hiding in Plain Sight* this coming Sunday, March 3. When asked, Council said yes and by all means let U-W Extension know they are welcome to host their exhibit in our building. The exhibit is of a typical teenager's bedroom – only this bedroom has thirty-five items that are hiding drug abuse in plain sight. Please plan to stop by the exhibit – before or after worship and let your friends and family know they are welcome too. Whether we have children in our care or not, this exhibit will be a good education for all.

Speaking of education, I have just completed a six-week on-line class on worship to help me plan ahead, choose a theme, scriptures and songs. The teacher, highly recommended that pastors do a series of services that fit together. As I make those decisions, (some with your input) I have been reminded to be aware that we each have our primary way to connect to what is going on around us. To meet our various preferences, worship needs to be multi-



sensory: so visual, auditory, tactile, and even occasionally including taste and smell. The class also addressed worship styles – some of us want to move and enjoy loud and energetic music; others enjoy quiet time and gentle music; some want our worship to follow a usual pattern; some a mix of all styles. Among us are friends who like to be involved while other want to sit back. Some of us like it when we are surprised by something new, and some remind me they want things kept the way it has been.

The title "Hiding in Plain Sight" is a good way to understand the theme I have chosen for our Sunday morning Lenten Services. Our theme for the six weeks of Lent will be "<u>Seeking God's Presence; Calling on</u> <u>God's Name</u>" from Isaiah 55. God is always among us, however sometimes we do not notice. You have named for me several places you find God and call on God's name: your bedrooms and out in the woods, as you are driving, at the cemetery, at the beach, in our sanctuary as you gaze upon the cross. A few have confessed to me, God is not as much a part of your life as you wish. My intent is to remind us look for God's presence in life's ups and downs and in our ordinary days so we might call on God's name at any moment. I am still working on the details of the services as I share with you the topics I have planned.

Stewardship News

<u>One Great Hour of Sharing</u> – One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) is the Lenten Offering of the United Church of Christ that supports disaster, refugee, and development activities worldwide. This offering will be collected in our church and other UCC Churches on **March 31**.

About 62% of this offering goes overseas in partnership with Church World Service, several Denominations in the US (including the UCC), and local relief agencies who have staff and volunteers organized in areas of need. Most of the expenditures are put into the budget to support longterm sustainable development. All funding is reviewed and monitored by a leadership

committee that also reviews grant requests for longterm disaster rehabilitation initiatives. The remainder of the OGHS offering, approximately 28% is used domestically for disaster relief, and to aid refugees and immigrants fleeing to the US and territories for a better life.

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering is extremely efficient, cost-effective way to reach out and help people near and far. On average, for every dollar given to One Great Hour of Sharing, 95 cents is used directly for mission programming; and 5 cents for interpretation materials. Any associated administrative costs are paid by gifts to our Church's Wider Mission National Basic Support. Support. Let's reach out on **March 31** to people who need our help including immigrants, people in the US and its territories, and people all over the world. One Great Hour of Sharing envelopes can be found in the pew racks. *Thank you for your support.*

<u>Second Half Group</u> – The Second Half Group met on February 19. A delicious lunch was served by Jenna of M&M Catering. Following lunch our guest, Eileen Miller, Senior Recreation Director from the Community Service of the Jackson County Prison presented a program on the projects that the Inmates work on for different agencies and Mission groups, such as the Christmas Angel Project. These items are donated except for some that are sold at the prison for needed items such as needles/scissors etc. As you come into the church in the Narthex you will see a sample of items that they will be donating to the Christmas Angel Project. There is also a basket under the table for donations. Material, yarn, batting (anything that can be used in the making of their items.) We thank Eileen Miller for her interesting and informative presentation.

Back Bay hosts mission groups who renovate homes – youth groups often paint homes. Back Bay also supports homeless people; helping them to apply for ID's to get their prescribed medicines and much more. Pastor Jacoba was a volunteer at Back Bay Mission for a month in 2004 and then she returned for a week in 2006 after Katrina.
