Jacoba's jottings... I got really lost in downtown Milwaukee. When I arrived last Friday I parked my car in the hotel parking structure. Our block was surrounded by construction. On Tuesday morning, I needed to move my car to another parking structure. I am not sure what I did to get off course, but I surely did. And without my GPS or a map, one-way streets and construction blocking streets I had no idea where I was or how to get to where I was going.



Getting lost can land us in interesting places and offer us new opportunities to see and experience what we otherwise would not have seen or done. I still remember our family getting lost driving through Detroit in 1968 in the area where a week later the Detroit riots took place. Seeing the neighborhood helped us understand why the riots were taking place. Getting lost in the Rocky Mountains led to views we would have missed had we not taken the dirt road up the mountain.

Getting lost can be more than geographical. Sometimes we lose our way in life. Jesus suggests that can be a good thing. Getting lost means having to re-focus. Where am I? Where do I want/need to go? Have I been here before? Does my past experience help me find my way now? Am I in new territory? Is there something I need to see or learn? Is there a new route I now need to take? Sometimes we need to get lost in order to find who and where we really are. Getting lost can save our lives. We realize something needs to change. Scared or overwhelmed or confused and even if we are excited, curious, adventurous, we realize we need a guide, a Savior. For Christians that guide is the Holy Spirit and the teachings and love of Jesus.

It seems to me, many of us have lost who we are; we have lost our souls in these days. Who does God want us to be? What does God want us to do? As individuals – as a church- as a nation. Acknowledging we are lost or have lost our way is the first step. Asking God for guidance is how we will find our souls. Our task in these days is to turn to God's word, and open ourselves to the Still-Speaking God in prayer so we find the direction God wants for us, for our church, community and nation. Trusting Jesus to be the way, the truth and the life will save us. Our Savior laid down his life, losing his life so that he and we would have new life.

Let's be adventurous, curious and open to the Spirit's leading.
