Jacoba's jottings... I asked Joel and Jeff Raine to help with moving the chairs from the church to the Shelter and setting them up for our worship service with Care & Rehab. Joel invited some of his buddies/customers who were at the BP Gas Station on Sunday morning at 7:45 to give him a hand. When I thanked the guys, one of them said we need to spread some love and kindness; there is too much hate in the world. Who can disagree?



Several weeks ago, I mentioned in a sermon that UCC seems to be a purple church. We have members who are a strong red or blue – and others like me, who vote a mixed ballot. One of our members commented our purple color has not only to do with politics, but also our theology, our morality, our social views. I would add it also has to do with local issues – such as support of or lack of school administration, ATV use of city streets and the new hospital. When our understandings are so different, it makes discussions difficult – whether we are sitting around a campfire, dinner table at the ball game, in the community or at church meetings or coffee hours. In no way do I see us moving toward hate locally, but I do wonder how our differences are affecting relationships and our conversations.

I wonder too if we are less friendly today. When I moved to Neillsville, I was taken aback by all the hellos as I was shopping. The checkers often engaged in small talk. Folks would stand around in the aisles and check-in with each other. Today, it seems we greet each other less often. Maybe it is obvious to others we are on a mission and there is little time for chit chat. Maybe we are too busy or too focused on the task on at hand to be interrupted. Or I wonder, have our differences silenced us?

As I said in the sermon on July 7th, the church may be a place to practice being in conversation with one another. If we are uncomfortable talking about issues which might divide us, maybe conversations about the weather, health, the kids and grand-kids or recent travels are good ways to get to know each other. I realize, we are often admonished to not discuss politics or religion; however we must remember Jesus and both the New and Old Testaments were and are very political. They are not partisan in the way of choosing a conservative or liberal side – however naming the Samaritan as the one who was merciful was very political. Saying that the powerful would be brought low was very political. Saying that those in power who do not show support to the widow, the orphan, the immigrant (sojourner in our midst is how the Old Testament sometimes names immigrants), the poor and needy will be overthrown by God working through Israel's enemies was very political. Those of us who love the Moses stories know how political it was for the midwives to protect the male babies and there is no denying as Moses stood before Pharaoh saying let my people (who were slaves in Egypt) go, he was being political.

Let's claim being a purple church and people—supporting one another, living in harmony with one another and working toward the good of all. Let our love be genuine, while hating what is evil. Yes, political—but not partisan.

The requests range from a ride to the grocery store, beauty parlor or some place else as they no longer have a car. Some families just need a volunteer to visit with their elderly loved one as they live in a different town. Some folks need some light house cleaning done or other chores the senior citizen no longer can do. There is no charge to the receiver of these services.
