Jesus said, "I assure you that everybody who gives even a cup of cold water to these little ones because they are my disciples will certainly be rewarded."

Mark 10:42

*Jacoba's jottings...*I walked to the Post Office yesterday, noticing as I walked down 2nd St the beautiful sky with one dark cloud. Walking home, the wind and rain came down in a cloud burst. Dee Zimmerman stopped and asked if I wanted a ride. Please. Yes. Thank you. I asked her where she lived – she was going out of her way to take me home. I appreciated her kindness.

When the rain subsided, Sandy and Paul Schmidt came to take pictures of me. 188 pictures later – with



Sandy snapping the pictures and Paul holding this big circle of reflexive material so there was no glare yet light on my face. What a gift to take that amount of time and effort — and that does not even take into account the work Sandy did after the photo shoot. I appreciated their generosity of time and effort.

A church member who struggles getting around went shopping. Store employees and other customers (youth to retirees) have helped him with finding what he needed, helping unload the cart into his vehicle and returning the cart to the store. People can be very kind.

However people can also be mean-spirited and unkind. Cameron Trimble, whose devotions I often read, spoke of microaggressions this week. She writes the "term microaggression was first used in 1970 to mean a comment or action that subtly and often unconsciously or unintentionally expresses a prejudiced attitude toward a member of a marginalized group (such as a racial minority)." Even here in Clark County, while we do not always notice marginalized people, they are among us. Most of us also hear comments or see actions on the news (and sometimes even in our own circles) which are microaggressions against people of color – black and brown people particularly. Sometimes prejudice is quite openly acted out or spoken. (I agree with Pastor Jim there is no place for the Confederate Flag among us.) There is no place for name calling or derogatory comments. I am still stunned when such behavior happens near or far. I wish more often that I would courageously challenge those who do so and speak the truth in love. Of course, in our day, hurtful and mean-spirited comments and behaviors do not only take place against people of color. Today, it doesn't take much for folks to get angry with, hurtful to and meanspirited with each other when there are disagreements.

Trimble on a recent trip to New York City was overwhelmed by countless acts of kindness. I too have witnessed many acts of kindness in Neillsville. Dee didn't have to stop; Sandy and Paul didn't have to go above and beyond in taking so many pictures of me. Strangers and store employees don't have to be as helpful as our member experienced. Trimble asked, could it be, that some of us are becoming **micro-loving**? What have you noticed? It doesn't take a lot to be micro-loving – a greeting, a ride, a phone call, a note, a plate of cookies or some cucumbers, helping a neighbor with jumper cables, a wrench or the lawn.

Micro-loving is what is needed today to counter the hurtful words and acts so prevalent in our society. Small acts of unexpected kindness touch lives; watch for them.; celebrate them. And be kind to one another; to say a kind word or offer a kindness. Let's change the world we live in! As Jesus said, "just a cup of cold water." Let us stand against unkindness with **micro-loving**.
