Ephesians 2:14, 17-19

Jacoba's jottings.... At the Faith Formation Retreat, I took some time alone to pray, walking the labyrinth. As I walked, the song "Let There Be Peace on Earth" came to mind. Then in my devotions this week, I felt led to Ephesians 2 and unexpectedly found the words above. Finding peace, working toward peace will be our theme this Advent and Christmas season. It is Christ who is our peace; it is Christ who proclaims peace to us; and it is Christ who brings together those who have differences so that we all become members of the one household of faith.

My travels in Greece made clear some of the challenges the early church faced. Among them was incorporating people from various cultures and different religious backgrounds into one household of faith. It could not have been easy. Creating one household of faith can be challenging as we come together from hither and you for the holidays. We openly talked about that a few years ago. Now many of us have become silent as more of what touches us deeply we no longer discuss or maybe even allow ourselves to feel. I think in our silence and apathy we have sacrificed working toward peace within ourselves and beyond ourselves.



As I have begun preparing for preaching in the Advent and Christmas Season, I have found the concept of peace if not the word "peace" in many of the suggested scripture readings. The wishing of peace is often the sentiment on Christmas Cards our friends and businesses send. Yet, peace seems elusive as we ramp up our holiday activities trying to fit them in without letting go of any of our year-round schedules.

Three words seem to pop-up regularly as ways to find happiness – maybe these words will also help us experience peace in our hearts and in the world. Kindness, generosity and gratitude – and as a theologian, I would add offering grace. What if we chose these words or maybe just one or two of them to focus our Advent and Christmas preparations. You might jump to the conclusion that I am suggesting we be more kind, generous, grateful and gracious to others. You are right. However, I also encourage us to be kinder, more generous, grateful and gracious to ourselves. I wonder if even centering on one of these words for this season would lead us to greater peace within ourselves and in the world – in our families, in the schools, in the communities and groups where we live, work and play. I think it is worth a try.

Teach an old IRA NEW GIFTS



IRA Charitable Rollovers (or Qualified Charitable Distributions)

If you are 70½ or older and have a traditional IRA, you may give up to \$100,000 per year tax-free to charitable organization(s). This is known as the IRA Charitable Rollover – or as the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) on your tax return. A married couple can each give up to \$100,000 from their respective IRAs each year. The gift can satisfy all or part of your annual Required Minimum Distribution (or RMD). The transfer to charity does not qualify for an income tax deduction but instead it escapes the income tax that you would have otherwise owed on your RMD. This avoidance of income tax is as helpful as a deduction, especially if you do not itemize your deductions.

The transfer must be made to charity by check or wire transfer directly from the IRA. If you accept your RMD before making the gift, you will owe the income tax. It is wise to consult your IRA custodian or financial planner to assist you. (Or you can contact Don Quicker)

We encourage you to consider an IRA Charitable Rollover (Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD) to your local church. You may make a direct charitable gift to fund your church's operating budget, fulfill a pledge, fund a special project or support your church's endowment fund to benefit your church in perpetuity.

To make an IRA Charitable Rollover (or QCD), please contact your IRA administrator to request the appropriate form, which can often be filled out online. If making your gift directly to your local congregation, you will need their Employer Identification Number (or EIN) and address. Your generosity will make a difference in the life of your local congregation and any other agencies including the wider church you support through an IRA Charitable Rollover (Qualified Charitable Distribution.
