**Jacoba's jottings...** As Jesus encountered people, it slowly dawned on them who he was. Experiencing his interest in them, his acceptance of them, his forgiveness, and love for them, their lives were changed. Transformed, they revealed who he was to others they encountered. The season of Lent is intended to renew and deepen our relationship with Jesus as we again realize who he is, what he does, and teaches. As he touches our lives, we are to make changes in the ways we relate to God in Jesus Christ and how we relate to one another and the world.

I realize it has been tradition to give up some item or some habit for Lent. I encourage us instead to focus on a closer relationship with Jesus. From all I read in the Gospels, Jesus wants to be in relationship with us, speak with us, forgive us, show us his love for us and give us new life. As we meet him, (sometimes we seek him out or sometimes he approaches us) he lets us know we are God's beloved children. He challenges us to live faithful lives and share who he is and what he has done for us as we receive his genuine love.

This year in the season of Lent we will turn both in Sunday and Midweek services to the Gospel of John. Our Sunday services will focus on how Jesus reveals himself through his relationships with individuals and how they then reveal him. In the midweek services Jesus will be revealed through his "I am" statements.


Jacoba's second page.... Way to go UCC! We gave 582 cans of soup to the Clark County Food Pantry. Yes, we outdid our neighboring
