Don't worry, I will explain to you how we do that. We had two Zoom Meetings yesterday; there will be more. We had children's time and a coffee hour on Sunday on Zoom. I also had a pastoral visit with Jim Filitz and Michelle Kranz – each in their homes. We prayed together, laughed together, named our challenges. God was with us. Yes, we can be in relationship with Jesus and one another while separated from one another.

Let us pray, Lord make yourself known to us wherever we are. We want to feel Jesus near – remind us of your promise that you will be with us always, even to the end of the age. Remind us that we do not need to fear for you are our Shepherd who walks with us through the darkest valleys. Hold us tight when we are afraid for ourselves, our loved ones and the future. Remind us that we are the Church – called to encourage each other, expected to receive the support our sisters and brothers in Christ promised when we joined the church. Please send me your email addresses. It is the best way to be in touch. Contact me. We will call everyone who doesn't have email to see what ways we might be in touch. We will send members who do not have email, a weekly devotion, announcements by mail or someone will call you and read the devotion and announcements to you each week. It will save us postage; plus we do not have access to a copier. We will send the same devotions and announcements by email. The church phones will not receive your messages.

Call Audrey or me if you have any need. If you are lonely, if you are scared, overwhelmed. I want to know if you are or a loved one are sick or in the hospital. I pray over the phone. I can't visit you at home or in the hospital – but we can be in touch. I can listen.

Please friends, stay in touch with each other. We don't want you to be sick. You don't want to pass on, without ever knowing it, the COVID 19 virus. Follow the best practices. Only be in physical contact with the people you live with and your caregivers.

I am writing this newsletter very quickly – so we can get it out before we vacate our building at 8am. We are in this together and I want to emphasize our faith in God and how we can be connected.

We will figure out how to do this – even how to celebrate Holy Week and Easter. Things change quickly in these days. Pray for one another. I am aware of three members who are testing sick people for the COVID 19 at the hospitals where they work. I am sure I will soon hear of members who are laid off. Contact your legislators to agree on legislation so that the people and small businesses who need help, get it. Do not get caught up in rumors; please check your sources. Remember to support our local businesses, if you are able... they are offering carry out; some of them are owned by our members who are trying to make a living, and some of our members are their employees. Russells, IGA and Kwik trip are delivering to people who are unable to make occasional trips to the stores.

The Peace of God be with you! The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you, the Lord be gracious unto you; the Lord grant you God's peace. Amen.
