Jacoba's jottings.... Last week, while participating in some continuing education, I heard a sermon, "The Certainty of Uncertainty." About all we can be certain of in these days is that just about everything is uncertain. This is not new. Two disciples walking on the road to Emmaus, going back home after the crucifixion did not know what the next steps would be. They had heard from some women that an angel had told them Christ was alive, however they had not seen him. Everything was so uncertain as they walked home still filled with sadness and some fear. In the midst of their uncertainty about what the future held for them, Jesus joined them. That Jesus is still walking with us is the one thing we can be certain of in the days of uncertainty.

I looked back at the newsletters of March, April and May. Lots of things have changed. We talk about a new normal – yet we are not there yet. So much remains uncertain.

So let me tell you what I know – This coming Sunday is Pentecost. I encourage you to wear red this weekend. The service will be recorded in the sanctuary and then broadcast on our public Facebook page, Neillsville United Church of Christ, at 10am on Sunday and then later reposted on our member only page, Neillsville UCC Closed Member Page and on our website, neillsvilleucc.org. The service will also be broadcast on the radio at 11am.

June 7 we will again worship virtually – the Sacrament of Holy Communion will be offered during our service on Facebook and during our radio broadcast. If you would like to receive the sacrament, please have bread or cracker or a muffin and wine or juice nearby. What I am uncertain about is when we will and how we will receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion when the congregation returns to worship in the sanctuary.

We are uncertain when our congregation will return to worship in the sanctuary. We are certain we will continue to stream our services on Facetime Live and broadcast on the radio. We will continue to send out bulletins by mail to those without email and by email each week. It is highly unlikely that we will sing during worship services in the sanctuary. We will certainly enjoy some music during our services. We are certain we will be seated physically distanced and we will be encouraged to wear masks. We can be certain God will be worshiped – and it will certainly be good to see each other again.

Certainty and uncertainly will continue. We can be sure though, the Risen Christ walks with us. The Holy Spirit has been sent to guide us. And I trust, we are each trying to do our best to serve the Lord and love one another in these uncertain times.

- We have offered a virtual worship service, a children's time, devotions and coffee hour every week on Facebook Live, Zoom and our church website.
- Bonnie Weyer has given an amazing amount of time to research, figure out how to do what she has read or heard and teach me how to do what we are doing to bring worship to you each Sunday. She has now begun to film Karen and me in the sanctuary, still trying new ways to improve upon the videotaped services. She has also been in contact with members to help us stay connected with each and do outreach – this on top of her work as the treasurer and officer of the church. Thank you, Bonnie!
- ✤ The Mission Committee, Board of Christian Education Committee, The Deacons/ Deaconesses, the Trustees, the Executive Committee, and the Circle of Friends have all met some in person, however always with a Zoom Connection as a possibility. The work of the church continues!
- ✤ The Executive Committee (Moderator Mike Perkl, Vice Moderator Paul Vine, Treasurer Bonnie Weyer, Secretary Dave Harnisch) along with the Pastor and others are meeting regularly to discuss our ministry and how we are to move forward. Thank you church leadership for taking on the responsibility of being educated so we can make faithful decisions for our congregation.
- The Mission and Outreach Committee is sponsoring a great ministry to offer cheese etc. to church members – who can, either enjoy the gift or if they choose pass it on to families in need in our community – while also supporting our dairy farmers. What a win – win!
- The Confirmation Class has completed our class time with me on Zoom and are now writing their statements of faith. Congratulations Class and yes there will be a confirmation service sometime!
- Church Connectors members are contacting other members, expressing care. In addition to the Church Connectors - I regularly hear about your phone calls and conversations with each other. Yay Church!
- ✤ Audrey, Jim and I are working to support the ministry of our members. Karen is back at the organ. Thank you Church Staff!
- Today, the overgrown and dying shrubs are being removed from the front of the church. Thank you Woodstock Nursery, Tom and Karen Wallace, and Dave and Carol Harnisch for your leadership.
- My ministry has also included writing emails, cards, texting and calling members. I have watched more Zoom meetings on how to do virtual ministry and services, about the future of the church, read more articles on recommendations by denominational leadership and local and state orders of what, how, when and where to do ministry than you can imagine. I have shared my learning with those of us who are entrusted to make various decisions. I have also participated in free virtual continuing education event. I am learning more and doing more than I ever expected.

Some personal comments - I care deeply about and for our congregation. As your pastor, you have been committed to my care – all of you. I made promises to God to regard all people with equal love and concern and undertake to minister impartially to the needs of all. These are difficult times and we are each trying to do what we feel is best. There are many opinions about what is and should be happening. I ask us to remain kind to each other and to remain true to our faith and calling as followers of Jesus Christ. In the UCC, we are given great freedom as to what we believe and how we enact our belief. In response to that freedom we are called to respect, honor and love one another. What one of us chooses to do or not do may not be the same choices others make. What neighboring churches do, may not be what our Executive Committee decides is right for us. We need to be true to who we are – asking the Holy Spirit for guidance.
