Jacoba's jottings.... "I don't know if I can hold it together." I hear those words often enough — as folks prepare to attend the funeral of a love one; when someone is going into a contentious meeting; when parents drop kids off for college or put them on the bus for kindergarten on the first day; when someone is furiously angry or filled with pride; when facing overwhelming changes. "I don't know if I can hold it together — or we can hold it together" is a sentiment often expressed in these days as well as we navigate the challenges and changes we are all facing. I am not convinced we have to hold it together as often as we think we do. There are times when falling apart or acknowledging strong emotions helps us move forward, find a new direction and new life. Tears, anger and fear allow others to see that we need some support as we move through hard times and into new life.

I appreciated Cameron Trimble's words yesterday (July 29)in her devotion, "Piloting Faith – a Word for the Day"  $^{\rm 1}$ 

Our world feels like it is falling apart. We don't know what to count on. We don't know who we can trust. We don't know what to believe. We don't know where to go or how to be safe getting there. We don't know if our elections are valid. We don't know if we are infected with a virus. We don't know if our companies will survive. We don't know what this trauma is doing to our children.

Trimble also reminds us that when all things are falling apart, there are opportunities to put together new possibilities. When what was is no longer available; it can be a time to call forth new life. Of course we need time to grieve and process what is taking place around us; however there comes a time when we need to move forward.

The truth is much of how things were being held together was no longer working well – in our personal lives and in the world. For at least a time, we were forced to do and imagine things differently. My fear is we are quickly moving back to what was not really working. Again we are over-extended; again we are divided; again we are making choices without looking for new paths that could bring about a fuller life. Are we again leaving God and the new life God wants for us behind?

My faith is God at work in the world and in our lives, ready to help us find a way through to new life when we realize we can't hold it all together. As Jesus' earthly life ended, he showed and taught us that there is new life for the dead and the living. Jesus showed us how God offers and brings about new life. Yet even in the days after the Resurrection, only a few of his followers took the risk to take up the new life Christ offered. It appears that is true again. Jesus encourages us to follow him – through the times when things are no longer holding together into a new life.

Maybe, just maybe, these are days to dream of a new world and find a new path. God has led the people through the wilderness to the promised land many times in the past. I bet God is ready to do that again.

# **Memorial/Endowment Fund Report**

As of June 30, 2020, the fund had \$416,689.05. This is the breakdown: \$22,137.34 (5.33%) in cash; \$119,551.71 (28.69%) in mutual funds; \$125,000.00 (29.99%) in Cd's; and \$150,000.00 (35.99%) in bonds. Our 2019 income was \$9136.39 from interest, \$2214.85 from dividends for a total of \$11,751.24 and \$1762.26 in capital gains which is reinvested. We only use interest and dividends to finance donations to the church. This year the fund has contributed \$12,000 to the church: \$5000 for the general operations, and \$7000 for the hearing loop system.
