Jacoba's jottings... It seems to me that we jump to assuming Jesus is talking about heaven (or hell) a lot faster than Jesus does. Jesus talks more often about being in relationship with him and bringing the Kingdom of Heaven down to earth than about whisking us to heaven. Our earthly relationship with him is his priority and needs to be ours. I was thinking about this as I thought about Audrey's retirement. The text – "Well done good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master" (Matthew 25 NRSV) I like the CEB translation too, "Excellent! You are a good and faithful servant! You have been faithful over a little. I'll put you in charge of much. Come, celebrate with me. "



I have used this text several times over the years at funerals, celebrating the end of life – however this day I see it as our continuing relationship with Jesus on earth. Good and faithful servants will know the joy of being in relationship with him; they are invited to celebrate with him.

Audrey has much to celebrate as she looks back over forty-two and a half years. There are many words one could use to describe her ministry among us — Faithful is at the top of my list. She has been faithful to her church and its members; your pastors have found her to be trustworthy; she has continued to take on more tasks, learning new ways of accomplishing her work. He came from the Eagle River area. We always felt much better when we had our Interim ministers to fill in for us when we were without our fulltime ministers. He filled our needs very well when he was here. Our deepest sympathy goes out to his family.

Five for Five Giving and the Emergencies across the US (and World)

Our Congregation usually receives for special offerings that support the needs of various people and situations around the world.

One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) is used to support people facing natural and human caused disasters. The gifts we have given in the past, go quickly to places in need – such as Iowa – where the winds flattened the crops, homes, elevators and now in response to the fires out west and the floods in the south. The moneys are disbursed and entrusted to local churches to share in their communities as they see the needs. (I was one who helped make such decisions in the 1993 Mississippi Flood in Iowa where I was serving). At this time we can direct our gifts to particular emergencies (Western fires for instance), to US Emergencies (covers all the US disasters – allowing OGHS staff to make decisions on where the funds are needed immediately) or to OGHS – which supports needs around the world. The Stewardship Committee encourages your generous gifts.

I might add that the pandemic closed our church camps this year – leaving them without their usual income. They ask for our support. The Wisconsin Conference is also finding itself with diminished income and would appreciate our gifts.

Thank you for your generosity. Many of you have faithfully supported our ministries in these times and we are grateful.
