"But there will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us." Isaiah 9

Jacoba's jottings... We already know the darkness as we enter the seasons of Advent and Christmas this year. We are already aware of some of what we will miss: we will miss some seasonal rituals – singing surrounded by the congregation, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," and "O Come All Ye Faithful"; we will miss the quiet light spreading across the sanctuary as we sing "Silent Night"; we already miss sitting with family and friends in the sanctuary and across the dining room tables. Many of us will miss seeing family members and friends we usually only see during the Holidays. Thanksgiving felt lonely and sad for many of us; it is dawning on us that Christmas may be more of the same. We are holding onto the hope of vaccines that will curb the spread and power of the virus so we might again soon celebrate with family and in the sanctuary our familiar rituals. But there is a stronger promise already made than any vaccine.. those who walked in the darkness will see a great light. A light shines in the darkness.

This year the birth of Jesus, our love for God and each other may touch our hearts with greater intensity than usual. The Thanksgiving and Christmas after my Dad died were hard; yet that year my family experienced greater faith in God and a closer relationship with each other. Confronted by the hardships of life, knowing grief, fear, isolation, can encourage us to create space for Christ to enter into our hearts.

Alone or in our smaller gatherings during the holidays, let's plan now how we will celebrate that God has

come to be among us. The One born in Bethlehem comes into the world to save us, encouraging us with hope, offering us peace, enabling us to rejoice, embracing us with love. Let us receive the gifts Christ offers to us: salvation, hope, peace, joy and love.



I want to assure you we will celebrate Advent and Christmas in the church this year. Already families are lighting Advent candles, the virtual choir is singing, the sanctuary is decorated at UCC. Communion will be served. Children will present their program. God

will be worshiped. Our virtual worship service means you will be able to worship together with families who live far away or who cannot join you in person this year. It means while enjoying your family gathering, you can together also take 30-40 minutes to celebrate that Jesus is born. Worship will be different, yet faithful and joyful. My hope is in some way what takes place for us at home will lift our spirits and touch us in ways we never imagined. Yes, Jesus will be in the very rooms where you join the shepherds in worshiping him.

Even this year, our celebration of Christ's birth can be as festive and faithful as we choose. Join us for worship each Sunday and on Christmas Eve - there are more details on page 2 of the Newsletter. Light the Advent log at home. Create a home worship center. Light candles with us on Christmas Eve. Gather in your circle – sing the carols together. Go caroling with your family singing at doorsteps and windows. Watch for the God moments. God's light will shine in the darkness.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM December 20

The Sunday School families are preparing for their Sunday School program. Each of the families are filming their children acting out a portion of the Christmas Story. Several of the children will also play an instrument or sing a song for us. Be sure to tune in – and remember to invite your extended family and friends to worship with us also.

#### **CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES – Candlelight Service**

Our Christmas Eve service will be broadcast on December 24 beginning at noon. We want everyone to be able to worship at a time that works best for their family. As you plan your Christmas celebrations, set aside a time when you will gather, not only in your own house – but maybe also with family members who are unable to be with you this year. One of the benefits of a virtual worship service is we can worship together no matter where we are.

We are giving our battery-operated candles to anyone who would like to join in letting the light shine as we sing "Silent Night" together during our Christmas Eve service. You are welcome to pick up what your family needs – let us know when it is convenient for you to stop by.

The work of the church is continuing. Committees are meeting and making decisions – on Zoom now. **Our church ministry is not closed or cancelled even though we are being the church together in new ways.** 

#### NEW CAMERA INSTALLED WIFI AVAILABLE

The Trustees and Church Council approved the purchase of a video camera to improve the livestream quality of our church services. This camera



was always part of the church's long range technology plan however with worship services now on-line the immediate need became evident. It will improve our video quality and decreases the work and time to create the service. Along with the installation of the camera and as part of the installation, Wi-Fi was improved throughout the building. There is now a staff only password protected wi-fi and a guest option. All members are welcome to connect to the UCC guest wi-fi at church.

#### SAM AND MARIAN RAY GIFT

A portion of the very generous gift given by Marian and Sam Ray through their estate was used to purchase the camera. We thank Sam and Marian for trusting the church council to wisely spend their gift for "religious purposes." A committee of the Council is now preparing a plan for the future use of the remainder of their gift. The Church Council met in October with the Rev. Andrew Warner, Director of Development of the Wisconsin Conference, for some guidance on how to put a plan into place for the use of these funds.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

The Sunday School recently completed a six-week session on the Lord's Prayer using material from Illustrated Ministry. Pastor Jacoba will teach Sunday School on December 6 and 13 as we read the stories of the Angels announcing the birth of Jesus and John the Baptist.

Pastor Jacoba will also teach the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade CDs on Wednesday evenings at 7:15pm.

## **VIRTUAL WORSHIP ONLY** (as shared in an email and in the weekly bulletin)

One of the many things I appreciate about our congregation is its care and concern for all within and beyond the congregation. This Council decision expresses that care and concern.

Council Members on November 17, with a unanimous vote decided that our services will be <u>only virtual at least through January 31.</u> This is due to the increase of people having COVID-19 in Clark County, our community and in our congregation. Our decisions have always been based on the health and well-being of our members and the recommendations of the Clark County Health Department and the Wisconsin Conference, UCC.
