"Don't be anxious about anything; rather bring up all your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7 CEB

*Jacoba's jottings...* God is faithful and anxiety is rising. I am grateful our God is gracious and while we are told repeatedly, do not be anxious, God understands. God knows what is causing the increased anxiety for each of us. God sees that so much of what is affecting our lives is beyond our control. God is compassionate.

When Paul wrote to the Philippians, he must have been aware that there were good reasons for their anxiety. I am sure Jesus also knew what was causing anxiety for his listeners when he encouraged, "do not be anxious." I do not experience Jesus as being judgmental when he says, "fear not." What I hear is he wants the best for us. Both Paul and Jesus knew anxiety could be debilitating. Anxiety can stop us from doing what we can and need to do. When anxiety is overwhelming we lose our ability to think clearly and respond appropriately. In Philippians 4, Paul urged his readers to name their requests in prayer before God rather than be anxious. Jesus reassured his listeners the God who responds to the needs of nature, will surely support those who are anxious.

Prayer, which by definition brings us into a closer relationship with God, is a valuable antidote for anxiety. Paul's recommendation to strengthen our relationship with God is good advice. As God has



supported countless people through their challenges, I urge us to ask God to guide us through our current situations. Those who wandered the wilderness with Moses walked a hard road – and at times they railed against God, but in the end God led them into the promised land. I don't know where God is leading us; I do trust that if we listen for God's answers to our prayers, there will be new life for us and the world.

Along with naming our requests, Paul encourages us to give thanks to God. Naming each day something, anything for which we are grateful causes us to look for that which is good, positive, hopeful. As we make it a habit to daily to thank God for at least one good thing in our lives, we will likely uncover more things that are good. Seeing the good rather than the fearful will also help relieve anxiety.

The Common English Bible translation of verse 7 intrigues me. "The peace of God promised to us will keep our hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus." In spite of what Jesus and Paul faced in their lives, their faith in God granted them peace. Their hearts and minds were kept safe even when the world was dangerous, even when they had little control over the circumstances they encountered. The world and many of us yearn for the peace of God that exceeds all our understanding. I find it reassuring that God intends to guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. With that reassurance, maybe we can follow Paul's recommendation, that

"from now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent, and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise." Philippians 4:8 CEB
