jacoba's jottings.... In these last weeks I have been preaching about call, the call of the disciples, the call of Samuel and Jonah. There will be two more weeks in the series. In this article, I want to move beyond our initial call to the life and work of the church and its members. In Ephesians Paul writes what he expects of those who are called into the church as followers of Jesus. We are all called to live lives that express love. In I Corinthians 13:4-8, Romans 12:9-18, in Colossians 3:12-15 Paul also reminds the church how Christians are to live together: we are to love each other and live-in harmony with each other.

The three texts from I Corinthians, Colossians and Romans are also frequently used in weddings naming how couples/families are live to together. However, Paul first used them to describe life in the church. They are good words in all circumstances.

⁴Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant⁵or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; ⁶it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸Love never ends". I Corinthians 13:4-8

Yet in these months, we have hardly had the opportunity to express love in community; even when we get together as families, or as friends, the possibility of getting sick or causing someone to get sick is often on our minds. Separated, unable to express love in our usual ways, many of us (and me too) shy away from conversations about what is truly important to us. It is not easy to be the body of Christ and yet it is our call. We so need community to be our best selves. We want to speak about what is important to us, yet there is apprehension about what we can freely say to each other from the depths of our hearts.

The church is to be a place of community; families are to be safe places where we can talk about what matters – however our conversations today too often are once or twice removed from face to face. Not able to love as we have always loved or live as we usually live causes us to be further alienated from each other. We are so in need of community where again we can talk together about what really matters to us, give hugs and see smiling faces. We are weary. We are yearning for love, community and conversation.

In these months of separation, much has taken place. It will take some work to again create the community we long for. Holding each other close – emotionally, physically, and spiritually will help. We will also need to work together to speak the truth with love. "Truth may be vital, but without love it is unbearable" The Two Popes

Together, let's figure it out – in the church- in our families – in our community. Let's work on living the calling to which we have been called, the call of love and truth telling, – Jesus' teachings will tell us how – the Holy Spirit will guide us – God's love will hold us tight.

Susie Karl prepares thoughtful, sometimes humorous devotions for us. I also offer a prayer that is more inclusive of particular needs than I can offer during our worship services. 

The Council met Tuesday, January 19, and made the decision to resume in-person worship on February 7 at 10am. We will continue to offer our services on You-tube, UCC-Neillsville, our website – neillsvilleucc.org, our Facebook pages and on WCCN 98.5FM and 1370AM.

If you feel safe and feel well, we look forward to seeing you in the pews again. All of the requirements for worshiping or being in our building remain in place.

Please Carefully Review the Guidelines We Have Set Out For Worship Services and the Use Of Our Building

- † There is hand sanitizer at the front door. Please use it as you enter the building.
- † All who are in the building will be required to wear a mask. If you cannot wear a mask, you are asked to worship with us on-line or on the radio.
- † The names of those present will be recorded to assist the Clark County Health Department if necessary with contact tracing.
- † Sit only in the designated pews maintaining a distance of six feet from anyone not in your household. Families living in one household are asked to sit together.
- † You can support our ministry through putting your monetary offering in the wooden box in the entryway, through your bank's bill pay,

- mailing your gift or placing it in our locked mailbox. We will soon offer an alternative way to support our ministries through the use of credit cards and automatic withdrawal.
- † We ask you to remain physically distanced as you enter and leave the building. We ask that you remain physically distanced in your conversations with each other— we encourage outdoor visiting whenever possible.
- † We will not share in a fellowship time; food will not be shared in our building.
- † The building will be sanitized according to CDC recommendations. Hand sanitizers will be made available.

The Annual Congregational Business Meeting will take place on February 14 immediately following the worship service. You may participate in person in the sanctuary or on ZOOM. Computer links and phone numbers will be sent out prior to the meeting. Annual Reports will be made available after February 5. Call the Church office to pick one up.
