jacoba's jottings... In many ways we are starting again. Last Easter, I led worship from my home and sang a solo of "Christ the Lord Is Risen," hoping you were singing with me rather than listening to me sing This Easter, all who feel ready to return to the sanctuary are welcome to do so – and those who would rather listen on the radio or watch on YouTube to worship God, can celebrate the resurrection where you are. Many people wish we could just get back to normal; I understand – me too. Yet, I am also told, "we like the shorter service"; and we like watching on-line or listening on the radio. And I hear, we are not yet comfortable being in a group. We are not yet in a place of returning to "normal" and if what I hear is accurate, we may never return to exactly what was. I grieve (and celebrate) that. I bet you do too.

We don't know yet what will be or how all things will shake out. And while, at times like others that makes me anxious – at other times, I remember God's faithfulness. Deep down, I know it will be ok. I believe all things will come together for those who love the Lord and are called according to God's purposes, even while not knowing what will be. I have also learned to wait upon the Lord. God will make clear who we are to be, what we are to do and how we are to do what we are called to do. God will lead us if we are patient and trusting. Remember, Israel wandered 40 years in the wilderness toward an unknown future– I hope our wandering is not that long. Yet in their wandering, God was creating a new people – a faithful remnant. God was leading and guiding. I believe God is doing that again.

In the meantime – while waiting in faith and with expectation we worship God and celebrate the Resurrection. I am grateful for the guidance of the Deaconesses and Deacons as together we discussed how to worship in Holy Week this year. Here are the details:

Palm /Passion Sunday – we will receive palms handed out by the children. The children will "parade" with me and the virtual choir will sing. We will move quickly from Palm Sunday to the Passion of our Lord. Three members and I will read the story of Christ's passion and crucifixion.

Maundy Thursday – 7pm; the service will focus on "The Lord's Supper". The elements will be consecrated before all leave in silence, taking the communion elements with us. We leave the Supper Table remembering Jesus and his disciples left their table and went to the Garden of Gethsemane. Those who choose can meet across Park Street at Lorraine's home – so that we might gaze upon the Resurrection window as we consume the elements. (I do not yet know if this service will be broadcast on Youtube.)

Good Friday – 12-3pm; Church doors will be open for personal quiet time in the sanctuary. Come and leave as you wish. There will be music, prayers and scripture available.

Easter Celebration Service – 10 am; The virtual choir will sing "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" with those at home joining in. After the in-person service all who wish may assemble in the parking lot and with Karen playing the organ and the sanctuary windows open we will sing "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" socially distanced.

Yes, we will remember and celebrate in new ways . I imagine the ways of worship also changed after the death and resurrection of Jesus. And was never again the same. They too had to figure all things out again. May God's Spirit and the love of Jesus guide us to a new beginning.

CONSTITUION AND BYLAW COMMITTEE TO BE FORMED

Moderator Paul Vine will formally announce at the upcoming April 18th quarterly meeting that a group will be formed to review and update our UCC Constitution and Bylaws.

Due to the growing challenge of recruiting a fairly large number of committee and board volunteers from a lessening church membership, the UCC Council is supporting an effort to reassess the number of members that the bylaws require for committee and board appointments.

In addition to the reevaluation of the current committee structure, the newly formed group may also visit the timelines for congregational meetings and elections.

Church members interested in joining the review group, or simply wish to provide suggestions, are asked to contact Moderator Paul Vine or Pastor Jacoba.

Following the quarterly meeting on April 18, the first meeting of this newly formed review group is planned for early May. The last review and update of the United Church of Christ Neillsville's Constitution and Bylaws occurred in 2012.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Like many of our committees and boards at UCC, the Stewardship Committee members did not meet often in 2020.

Although sharing the challenges that all church volunteers have faced, Stewardship Committee members managed to communicate and make some headway, regardless of the pandemic.

Former co-chair, M.E. Sjolin, provided the Council at its September 2020 meeting an update on activities and plans, including the effect that the pandemic had on our best intentions.

Former co-chair, Emile Miller, provided a report to those attending the February 14th Annual Meeting, where she highlighted the membership's involvement in a four-month webinar on generosity hosted by Rev. Andrew Warner.

With activities limited all around, members did not meet to select a Volunteer of the Year in 2020, but it is the hope of members to carry on with this award in 2021.

More recently, member Kelley Burch provided a service reading for the *One Great Hour of Sharing* mission, and a video was selected and shown to encourage members of the congregation to give of their treasures.

Membership in the Stewardship Committee changed dramatically, with the terms of three highly involved, long-term and experienced members expiring: Sue Voigt, M.E. Sjolin, and Emile Miller. We welcomed, beginning last year, newer member Kelley Burch, and in March new member Jo Ann Voss. M.E. Sjolin has made herself available to offer her experience and guidance since most members are new to the committee. Longtime member Marge Goetsch is continuing.

Other missed hands-on opportunities for the committee in seeking generosity from the congregation was the unfortunate shelving in 2020 of the *One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need, and the Christmas Fund* missions. Not all was lost, however, as the generosity of the Church Council came through, providing available funds so the church could meet its obligations to all missions. A huge "Thank You" goes out to the voting members and members of our financial team for fulfilling our church's Five for Five obligations in 2020.

The Stewardship Committee members are planning to meet formally for the first time since the last Zoom in September of 2020. The first meeting in 2021 is tentatively planned for mid-April.
