**jacoba's jottings...** In the Old Testament book of Judges there is an interesting story of Gideon who God commissioned to deliver Israel from Midian, Israel's enemy. Gideon was not convinced it was the Lord God of Israel who was speaking to him so he devised a few tests to discern whether the voice he heard was indeed the Lord's. In Judges 6, we read:

<sup>36</sup>Then Gideon said to God, "In order to see whether you will deliver Israel by my hand, as you have said," I am going to lay a fleece of wool on the threshing floor; if there is dew on the fleece alone, and it is dry on all the ground, then I shall know that you will deliver Israel by my hand, as you have said." <sup>38</sup>And it was so. When he rose early next morning and squeezed the fleece, he wrung enough dew from the fleece to fill a bowl with water. <sup>39</sup>Then Gideon said to God, "Do not let your anger burn against me, let me speak one more time; let me, please, make trial with the fleece just once more; let it be dry only on the fleece, and on all the ground let there be dew." <sup>40</sup>And God did so that night. It was dry on the fleece only, and on all the ground there was dew.

In these days, there are some who are wonder if God has a new word for the world. Is God doing something new? Are we to do something new? We who are wondering have noticed there seems to be new opportunities because much of life was put on hold for a time. We are also aware that what was, was not working. So many people talked about being too busy and exhausted and not getting anywhere. We were beginning to notice the discrimination against people of color. In Wisconsin indigenous people are reminding us of their challenges in American society today. We are hearing about climate change and how big cities were cleared of their haze for a time when their citizens were staying at home. The church as we know it has been declining since the 1950's. Less than 50% of Americans now claim church membership (though a greater percentage of people acknowledge faith in God.)

I wonder if God has something new for our world, for the church, for us as families and individuals In the UCC, we say, "God is still speaking." Recently, my email has included numerous notices of classes, articles and devotions encouraging us to listen and discern what God wants for the world. Gideon wanted to know if it was really God who was speaking to him. That seems a fair question in our world today.

I invite us to listen for God's Word, to evaluate what we hear in light of our own fears and bias, and in discussion with others. Following Jesus must be a priority for Christians. Listening for the voice of God is essential.

In the month of June, I plan to preach on "Is God Doing Something New?" using scriptures from the lectionary. Join us in person, on the internet and radio. I hope you also will engage with me and our UCC members what you hear God saying in these times.

Members had the opportunity to review the Stewardship Committee section in the church's Constitution/Bylaws, and all agreed to report to the Constitution/Bylaw Review Sub-committee that the committee has no recommendations for changes to the existing wording.

Members will continue to review upcoming webinars, seminars, and workshops for opportunities to glean more information on ways to encourage generosity. More recently, committee members M.E. Sjolin and Jo Ann Voss, along with Pastor Jacoba, sat in on several meetings sponsored by the Wisconsin Council—United Church of Christ during its Annual Meeting, along with participation by Moderator Paul Vine and Vice-moderator, Barb Petkovsek.
