jacoba's jottings... Happy Fourth of July! Many of us are looking forward to celebrating our freedom. We have gotten our shots or are at peace with the decisions we have made. We sometimes feel a greater peace when we know what we believe and want to do. As Christians we are called to be aware of and faithful to the ways of Jesus Christ.

While celebrating our freedom we also need to remember that our collective and individual circumstances have been filled with trauma and grief. Last week, I participated in a webinar on Mental Health and Spiritual Care. Whereas in the past it was thought one person in four was struggling with a mental illness, available data suggests now one in two are suffering. The losses and grief we have experienced are leading to depression and anxiety. It was noted there is a collective grief as well as individual grief. Our nation grieves – the world grieves. Many are grieving what was, is now and what will be. We need to be kind to each other, knowing many are carrying hurt, anger, sadness, and grief. Our losses and our feelings need to be taken seriously. Grief unexpressed or not taken seriously increases over time rather than diminishing. Grief is expressed through anger, denial, bargaining, depression, moving toward acceptance of the losses we have experienced.

Responses to grief are unique to each of us. In obituaries today we find the variety in ways families and friends acknowledge death and remember the deceased. How we grieve affects our relationship with one another; if one person is openly grieving and the other is quiet about their grief, hard feelings may ensue – thinking one or the other is not grieving appropriately. When one person is hopeful while another is consumed with anger about a loss, relationships can be shaken if not ended. Collective grief is also manifest in a variety of ways – the violence of January 6 was a way of venting grief. Concerning the pandemic some were angry that others did not take seriously the risks, while others were angry about losing autonomy. Political differences are often based on fear of loss and grief.

According to Kubler-Ross acceptance of the loss is the last stage of grief. Her co-writer David Kessler now suggests a sixth stage – "finding meaning in our losses and griefs." To come to a peace about the losses we experience he suggests we name: the meaning of our losses; the directions our losses take us; how we move forward in our lives. An example given was the response to 9-11 – what meaning did we draw from that experience and how have we moved forward taking into consideration what happened? When there is a death or a job loss – how will we resume living life and what do we take away from our loss and our grief?

Another important aspect of grief is acceptance of our own feelings and experience as well as accepting the feelings and experience of others. Do not judge your or another's feelings or experience of loss.

What have you lost, how are you grieving; and what meaning do you find in your loss? Have there been gains as well as sadness and disappointment; can you see growth in faith and new opportunities? As we celebrate our freedom and independence, I invite us to take seriously all our feelings and the feelings of others. We have lived through a trauma to our heart, body and soul as individuals and a nation.

In these days let us offer to ourselves and to others the Fruits of the Spirit. They are: *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.*

UCC 's 2021 East-West Landscape Project

At the beginning of the year, the church Trustees announced their interest in adding more landscaping at the church. In addition, the possibility of obtaining grant money provided incentive to proceed with the planning.

Church members Dave and Carol Harnisch, along with Karlene Wallace, were approached by the Trustees to write up a proposal for the UCC's 2021 East-West Landscaping Project.

In late April, Dave and Carol provided an initial outline of the project beds to fellow team member Karlene Wallace, meeting with her at the church site on several occasions to get her perspective on appropriate shrubs and their availability.

The church Trustees received the formal written proposal from the planning team at its May 18th meeting, where its membership approved the implementation of the project and purchases. On June 14th, a volunteer crew met in the morning to remove the sod and install the beds' edging blocks. A week later on June 21st, the shrubs were planted with care, and the mulch delivered by Paul Vine topped off the project.

The labor crew members for both workdays were Byrl Buddenhagen, Hap Eddy, Carol Harnisch, Dave Harnisch, Mike Perkl, Bob Petkovsek, Craig and Wendy Sigurdson, their grandson Owen, and Paul Vine.

The shrubs planted were "Blue Chip" Blue Star Juniper, "Green Velvet" Boxwood, "Amethyst Mist" Heuchera, some gifted Hosta, a "Violet Uprising" Lilac, and "Pretty in Pink" Pulmonaria. Report by Dave Harnisch

UCC Constitution and bylaw Review Committee Update June 30, 2021

In May 2021 an ad hoc committee, composed of Doris Bakker, Dave Harnisch, Barb Petkovsek, Paul Vine and Pastor, started to review and update the constitution and bylaws. The purpose is to ensure both documents reflect changing church demographics, committee, and leadership structure, recently incorporated financial audits and other language.

The committee has met three times and will continue in July and August. Once a preliminary draft is completed it will be shared with various committee chairpersons and members, who will provide input and suggestions.

In October the review committee will present a draft of the updated bylaws to membership at the October quarterly meeting. Final approval of the constitution and bylaws is scheduled for the January 2022 annual meeting. Stay tuned for more updates.
