jacoba's jottings... Karlene and one of her employees checked out my flower gardens a week or two ago. Her employee marveled at the hibiscus and the other flowers growing in



my yard. The flowers are especially pretty this fall. I have so enjoyed them. Some of the plants are now browning and beginning to die the hibiscus is all flowered out. The season is changing and will soon come to an end.

Truly, for everything there is a season. I have learned that as the seasons change, I too will need to make different choices. Instead of plucking off the Japanese beetles and watering my plants, I will need to dig up the bulbs and rake or mulch leaves. While I like

raking, I know mulching is good for the soil and next year's growth. I also trust some of the bulbs I dig up this fall will sprout next spring; others will shrivel up and need to be

tossed away. Come spring, I may buy some new bulbs and plants to replace the ones that I discarded. The hibiscus is always a surprise. It doesn't show any signs of having survived the winter, sometimes until mid-June. I have started to dig it up to discard it only to discover below the soil it is beginning to sprout new life. I am learning to be patient.

As seasons come and go, how long are we willing to wait for new life? When and how will we know it is time to discard the old and change out or toss what no longer works? Discorpment (prayer) and soaking the



out or toss what no longer works? Discernment (prayer) and seeking the knowledge and wisdom of others is often required to know what to hold onto and what to let go. Maybe we can try for one more season what has given us joy in the past, yet in the garden there comes a time to let go of what is no longer offering new beauty. I may try to buy plants that look like the ones I had before, but often they are no longer available. I need to move on and find something new if I am to again fill my garden with beauty.



Ruth Z. gave me a chrysalis this year. I watched the cocoon transform and then the butterfly emerged. I was amazed – and then Ruth said that butterfly might only survive two weeks. How disappointing! I thought I saw it one day, but when I sent Ruth a picture of it, she said, it wasn't the one she and I had protected until it emerged. However, it was still beautiful – and I have found myself enjoying the butterflies even more this year than usual.

COPYRIGHT WEBINAR

Jo Ann V, Karen, Janice and Pastor Jacoba watched a video on copyright infringement offered by the Insurance Board and taught by the UCC General Counsel. We were shocked to learn fines for copyright infringement of any kind have cost some churches \$750-\$30,000 – plus damages for earnings lost.

We were told we must have licenses to print the words of hymns and to stream the music. **We do**. However, every piece of music – and the arrangement we use must be checked to see if it is in the public domain or covered by our licenses. We must then note our license on the screen and all written documents.

If another's person's work is copied, used or read, the creator or company must be contacted to ask permission, unless permission is already given.

You may say, this is crazy – however remember, the creators of the music, pictures, art, writings,

videos, deserve to be paid. It is unethical to use what another creates to earn their living without paying them for it. And it could cost us if we do – both a fine and damages for the loss of their income.

Hymnals with the tune will be available for those who want the notes. We can only print or stream words. We have also purchased the right to use contemporary music from Convergence – Bryan Sirchio is one of their composers.

Some may wonder how would we be caught? Anything we put on the website – newsletter, calendar, worship services can be searched or someone could tell an owner of the works we use. A computer search is how the name of the Christmas Angel Project we were using was discovered in our newsletter. We received a letter saying we had to change the name of our Christmas Project or be taken to court.

Please understand we will do our best to follow the laws. Your help to also honor copyrights will be appreciated.
