Dear Members and Friends of the United Church of Christ, Neillsville,

As I move into my fifth week with you, I must say that post- COVID (or so we hope) I was not expecting to see the church as active as it is.

Many churches are struggling to get their ministries up and running and especially to get those who drifted off during COVID back into the pews again. We have seen a drop off in attendance over the past two years due to the pandemic, but I am confident that will recover with an outreach from some of us in the near future. We will be talking more about this.

As many of you know, the Northwest Wisconsin Association of the UCC held their annual meeting this past Saturday (4/24). I am not a big fan of meetings, but I must admit that I found this one to be exceptional. You see, when it comes time for the nominations report and for filling open and often numerous officer slots and committee members, a noticeably high number of folks slouch way down in their chairs trying to be less visible or excusing themselves to use the rest rooms or get a drink or.... well, you get the picture. Not so this time! There were numerous openings on committees. When the call went out for nominations from the floor, hands shot up for every position. Not only that, persons attending via Zoom volunteered for positions via Zoom Chat. I have participated on average in about 3 or 4 of these types of meetings a year for several decades and had NEVER experienced anything like that. The Rev. Dr. Rob MacDougall, our Association Minister, mentioned how unusual this was as he closed the meeting.

As I reflected on that experience, it became clear to me that what I may have witnessed was a need many of us have to connect once again with and to meaningfully support the church of Christ. The feeling that we have been separated for far too long has us in search of meaningful engagement with God's creation and what better way to do that than through the vast array of ministries available to us through the greater church.

Post pandemic church folks around the country are wringing their hands about the health of the church universal. But I see hints, like this past Saturday, that the Spirit is working among us and that there is potential for the church to emerge from these times of isolation in better shape than going in.
