On May 17 the council, using the above criteria and qualities, reviewed the seventeen (17) nominated members. The Council selected those who they believe possess these qualities. On Wednesday, June 15 the committee will meet with Rev. Dr. Rob MacDougal, for an orientation meeting. As the committee gets organized they will provide the congregation regular updates and status reports in the newsletter and bulletin.
