Dear members and friends of United Church of Christ Neillsville,

My wife, Dorry, was a long-time Master Gardener in Wisconsin and in just the past week deemed a Master Gardener in Colorado. Plants, growing environments and techniques are so very different between the two areas. She has not returned to Wisconsin for over 3 years until this past week. In her short stay we went to the Neillsville Farmer's Market, toured the area running into one of her friends from Oshkosh at "Schmitty's On Main St." who moved here about 20 years ago, attended church (of course) where she met a warm, welcoming congregation. We then visited friends and relatives in the Fox Cities, Green Bay, and Door County.

Here are just a few comments she made to me about the area during her visit and as she was leaving:

- How wonderful it was to see the plush green growth all around us. The earth is just so rich and vegetation so healthy and green.
- Look, Gary, at how large your(potted) tomato plants are and all the tomatoes you already have. Mine (in CO) are a quarter of the size, look anemic and have no tomatoes yet.
- I had forgotten how majestic the trees look here. They are so very tall by comparison to Colorado and they have leaves rather than almost all with needles.
- It is so different to see all this water. I really enjoyed sitting by the Black River and taking pictures of grasses, flowers, butterflies, dragonflies, the river and the fish you caught.

Now those are just a few of the many very positive comments she made about her visit. To help put this in perspective let me share that she, being a very busy person in our home community, infrequently visited churches I served as interim. I would be the one to periodically visit at our home base. Upon departure from this visit, she told me she was already excited about her return to Neillsville. That said a great deal to me about this area you call home and the people you call neighbor. I don't mean to imply that there isn't much to be thankful for in Colorado. There is. I tend to take note of God's blessings anywhere I find myself, but it was so wonderful to see, once again, that appreciation of God's creation so clearly experienced and expressed by someone else. That someone else, now coming from what is claimed by many as one of most picturesque places on earth, cannot wait to return.

How easy it is for me, and I suspect some of you, to take the beauty of this particular tiny spot on the globe and those who share it with us, for granted. I need to continue to be aware of and to be thankful for the blessings all around me. Thanks, Dorry, for the visit and for a clearer, deeper appreciation for the many blessings we have right here.

THE LOCAL CHURCH PROFILE AND VISIONING WORKSHOPS from Barb Petkovsek

The Search Committee is in the process of completing the Local Church Profile which is a document that, when completed, is the foundation of the Search Committee's work. The basic question that the Local Church Profile is defined to answer is "How do we understand ourselves as a church?". The information gathered when developing the Church Profile helps determine the congregation's "personality" and style of carrying out God's mission.

In an effort to be intentional about "who we are as a congregation" individual committee members are going to meet with Christian Education, Circle of Friends, Trustees, Deacons and Music Committee. If you are not connected to one of these groups and would like to be included in a conversation regarding the Profile please contact Barb Petkovsek at 715 429-0486 and you will have opportunity to join in one of the groups.

The Congregation will have opportunity to review the Profile when the Committee has their draft completed. After the congregation comments on the Profile the Committee will have the final Local Church Profile completed and can then begin the call process.

At the same time that the Search Committee is gathering information and completing the Local Church Profile, Pastor Gary is holding Visioning Workshops. Some of the information that Pastor has gathered for and during the visioning sessions will be beneficial in completing the Church Profile. The visioning process will help the church to think through and determine who God is calling us to be. Then assist the church to pull together goals and a timeline to reach that point in our ministry. The visioning meetings can also assist in providing

a clearer picture of characteristics and skills that we may want the new settled pastor to possess to assist us in moving toward our vision.

When this work is done, our congregation as a whole, and with the Search Committee, will have a better sense of how we understand our gifts, vocation and identify as God's people. This will give us a clearer vision of the kind of pastoral leader we are seeking as we search for a settled Pastor.
