Dear Members and Friends of the United Church of Christ Neillsville,

Well, the pre-election videos and other media hype is picking up to a feverish pace. I saw over 5 ads in about two hours and the frequency seems to be on the increase. What bothers me about them is that very few are about policy issues and laws "like the good old days" but about character assassination much of which exaggerates, distorts and takes the truth out of context and in some cases offers up flat out lies. I wish I could say it is a characteristic of only one party but it is not.

Several things concern me about this. The first is that many folks blindly follow those ads based on loyalty to a party rather than rational assessment and consideration of the source of the information. It is really easy to believe the worst of someone you consider to be the opponent. Second, is the unfortune negative impact these ads have on the persons attacked, their families and friends. It seems that the political arena has subscribed to working toward "party success" without consideration of morals taught not only by Jesus but most every other religion in the world.

At least two things are important as we enter the stormy season between now and the elections. Use your head. Understand the real substantive issues and pay little attention to unsubstantiated or exaggerated attack ads by sponsorship groups.

Jesus became upset at the money changers, chasing them out of the temple and turning over tables. How do you think Jesus would react today to what we are witnessing in our politics? I envision him reacting much the same but in the end, I believe he would be encouraging folks in and out of government to express their own and their constituent's beliefs and desires, to listen to and understand other's positions without attacking them, and to focus on bringing peace, prosperity and fullness of life to peoples in our country and everywhere.

You and I are not in Washington making decisions on how we reinject civility and compassion back into our politics but we all have a vote. Please consider when you go to the polls who best represents your values and morals. (And please do go to the polls.)



#### Youth Group Leader Proposal

Our church was blessed with a gift from the Marian and Sam Ray Estate with a designation for youth activities. Some of the monies have been used for camp scholarships. The Leadership Council, based on the visioning sessions and small group conversations regarding youth programing has allocated \$5000 from the Ray fund to hire a leader for a Wednesday after school program. The trial program will run two Wednesdays per month, from December 2022 through March 2023

The program will be designed for 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade youth. The leader, along with a small church team, will plan and execute the afterschool program. We are looking first for a leader from our church, and will look to the community if there is not internal interest.

This program of doing "different things in different times" will be designed in an effort to bring positive change to the youth identified. Once the program design is developed, we will need volunteers that could prepare meals, help facilitate the meetings and plan for other activities that the group may do on weekends throughout the year.


