### PASTOR'S MESSAGE FOR FEBRUARY

It's a pleasure to be "back in the saddle again" (sort of) working with Sue Vornholt in our tag-team interim ministry for the United Church of Christ in Neillsville. The two of us have worked out a schedule and keep in touch with one another to coordinate ministry in the interim time between Gary Wilner's helpful leadership as full-time interim and the new "settled" minister you will hopefully find before too long. In the meantime, we'll do our best as quarter time interim ministers for NUCC.

As you know both of us are retired folks who enjoy our retirement as well as time with our families. You may see the Vornholts on one of their daily walks along Neillsville's streets or in the arboretum and me either making my way to fetch a turnover at Love + Flour Bakery or heading to a ski trail, either "up the creek" or out at my therapist's office, also known as the ski and bike trails of Levis Mound. Even in our retirement we enjoy our continuing connection with a great congregation known as "UCC" and we want to be helpful to you.

Sue and I have worked out a preaching schedule so that each of us preaches about the same number of Sundays. Sue has kindly agreed to attend meetings and keep me abreast of what the church is planning. Both of us are available for consultation and conversation and are certainly glad to make hospital calls and help in grief situations. We hope to organize a "Called to Care" ministry in conjunction with lay folks to keep in touch with homebound members. And we are now also working with our friends at Calvary Lutheran Church to plan a stimulating midweek Lenten series.

You may also be interested to know that there are some changes taking place in the Wisconsin Conference of the UCC. Both Sue and I are serving on committees in the Northwest Association (for which Sue is moderator!) and the Conference. For many years I have chaired the historical committee of the Conference, and we are now involved in the move of the Conference offices from the Trost Center in DeForest to the Daycholah Center on Green Lake, which will take place in the spring. One of our challenges is deciding what to keep and what to dispose of.

Of course, a significant change for the Northwest Association has been the retirement of the Rev. Rob MacDougall as associate conference minister for our Association in December and the calling of the Rev. Michael Jones to succeed him. Rev. Jones will be the one primarily responsible for working with our search committee to find a new "settled pastor".

Rev. Jones comes to us from Arlington Heights, Illinois where he served as pastor of St. John's UCC. He and his husband Blake, together with their two young daughters have just moved to Eau Claire. An Ohio native, Michael received a bachelor's degree in religious studies from Indiana University and a Master of Divinity from Harvard Divinity School. In his free time, Michael enjoys spending time with his family, swimming, playing the piano, singing, and studying history. Maybe we can get him to share his musical talents with us when he makes his first formal visit to Neillsville!

During February we will continue our celebration God's manifestation or "Epiphany" in Jesus Christ as we also get ready to observe the sacred season of Lenten, beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Sue and I look forward to ministering with you.

### LENTEN SERIES TO FEATURE "SILENT WITNESSES"

This month our church will resume its practice of cooperatively sponsoring Wednesday mid-week Lenten services with Calvary Lutheran Church just down the street. The theme will be "Silent Witnesses to the Crucifixion" with services and soup suppers alternating at each church. Pastors Sue Vornholt and James Mohr will share responsibilities with Pastor Chad Anderson of Calvary Church. Soup suppers will begin at 6:00 p.m. followed by worship at 7:00 p.m.

Throughout this Lenten Season we will have the imaginative, challenging, and faith-strengthening opportunity to hear several "Silent Witnesses" to the crucifixion speak to us. On Ash Wednesday our witness is the thorn. In succeeding weeks, we will hear from the robe, the nail, the spear, the shroud, and the stone.

- February 22 (Ash Wednesday): "The Thorn" at Calvary with Susan Vornholt preaching.
- March 1: "The Robe" at UCC with Chad Anderson preaching.
- March 8: "The Nail" at Calvary with James Mohr preaching.
- March 15: "The Spear" at UCC with Chad Anderson preaching.
- March 22: "The Shroud" at Calvary with Susan Vornholt preaching.
- March 29: "The Stone" at UCC with James Mohr preaching.
- April 6 (Maundy Thursday): "The Cup and Loaf" at Calvary with preacher to be determined.
- April 7 (Good Friday): To be determined.

**UCC** and Calvary will be combining choirs for singing on Ash Wednesday. If you are interested in joining in -practices will be Wednesday, Feb. 1 and Feb 15 at 6:30 and Feb. 22 prior to service at Calvary.


