2023 Holiday Fair

A side note with that vote that we had from our special meeting after church on Sunday, October 22, 2023 ... Carla wanted to speak but due to the limited time so everyone could attend the Ukrainian meal, we just had a very short meeting.

The money in our Holiday Fair account was not raised just by the Holiday Fair ladies; it belongs to EVERYONE in our church. We have so many people who have very generously donated items to make our crafts with from wood, windows, buckets, sleds, pine boughs; not to mention all that have donated money to buy supplies. Not to mention the individuals that donated baked goods, greeting cards, and all the items to our New to Your Treasures. We could NOT make the money we do each year at our Holiday Fair, without all these people, both men and women, so we need to give back to our church in whatever way needed.

The total invoice for the blacktop was \$23,910 with funds raised through donations, chili feed and baked goods auction raising \$7,373.57. Wendy Sigurdson made a motion to pay the remaining amount of \$16,536.43 to the parking lot, seconded by Kathy Mathis with all "aye". Motion carried unanimous.

#### Watch "One Good Reason"

On our "Thank You" Sunday, October 22, the stewardship committee recognized the donors to the Ukrainian Fund for their generosity, invited the Ukrainian family who received the donations, and showed the video "One Good Reason" as the sermon.

We invite you to watch this moving story of empathy, hope, and human ingenuity—made possible by the Welcome Connect platform. "One Good Reason" is a powerful documentary produced by Tribeca Studios. The film captures the story of one family's journey to escape the violence of war, a U.S. family's efforts to help them rebuild their lives, and a community stepping up to support them both.

The 25-minute film follows the Hnatiuks, a Ukrainian family with two young children, as they flee the war in their home country, the generosity of an American couple from Unity, Wisconsin – complete strangers – who offer to be their sponsors and the bond they create together.

The film features the online platform created by Welcome.US, which allows Americans to connect with people seeking refuge in the U.S. through the government's humanitarian programs, which require the support of a sponsor.

#### Christian Education

Stephanie Heck shared the following:

- No committee meeting this month.
- The first night of our joint Confirmation and Sunday School with Calvary had an attendance of 70 children, with a few missing. Attendance from our church was 31 kids from 3K to Confirmation, along with some new non-members.
- Pastor Chad and Cheryl met with the confirmation children.
- Everyone, including confirmation students, will be meeting at our church on Wednesday, September 27.
- The children will be singing during the church service on Sunday, October 22.
- Confirmation is a two (2) year program, with only 8<sup>th</sup> graders being confirmed. We have seven (7) 8<sup>th</sup> graders and three (3) 7<sup>th</sup> graders from our congregation.
- Looking into having our 8<sup>th</sup> graders attend a weekend Youth Fall Camp but currently it is full; we are on a waiting list.

#### **Deacons**

Karlene Wallace shared the following:

- What requirements do the confirmation students need to complete before being confirmed, such as attending our church services on Sunday mornings, etc. Maybe they could serve by lighting candles, greeting, ushering, etc.
- Communion will be served up front again next month.
- The committee only received eight (8) responses for volunteers ushering and serving coffee in response to letter/e-mail.
- Working on developing a new letter to send out and assign ushers, etc. The Council recommends calling and asking members which area they would like to serve.
- The passing of the offering plate has been discussed again with no definite decision.
- Our Baptismal fountain needs repair, and the committee has decided to accept the baptismal fountain that was offered as a donation from another UCC church, if still available.
- Pastor Jim and Pastor Sue will continue to fill the pulpit.
