"Christmas Time is Here"

One of my Friday evening rituals used to be sitting in an easy chair and listening to Michael Hanson's jazz broadcasts on Wisconsin Public Radio. Each year on the Friday before Christmas his show featured jazz renditions of Christmas music, both secular and sacred, ranging from Louie Prima's raucous rendition of "What Will Santa Claus Say (When He Finds Everybody Swingin')" to Charlie Byrd's gentle guitar interpretations of carols like "Silent Night". My favorite was Rosemary Clooney singing "Christmas Time is Here" in a wistful, melancholy manner:

Christmastime is here Happiness and cheer Fun for all that children call Their favorite time of year Snowflakes in the air Carols everywhere Olden times for ancient rhymes Of love and dreams to share Sleigh bells in the air Beauty everywhere Yuletide by the fireside And joyful memories there Christmastime is here We'll be drawing near Oh, that we could always see Such spirit through the year



Ah, don't we all wish to retain "such spirit through the year." This month we will be preparing for our celebration of Christ's birth during what the church calls Advent, which means coming. We will be decorating, baking, and sharing in various ways as we gradually (I hope) make our way to the manger on Christmas Eve. The temptation is to rush the season so that by the time Christmas Day finally arrives we are sick of all the canned carols and fake garlands and just want to move on....to whatever.

Of course, as Duke Ellington noted, "Things Ain't What They Used to Be". My mother talked about not seeing the family Christmas tree until the doors were opened to the living room on Christmas Eve. Back in "the good old days" people waited. These days we're not so good at waiting. But we're still wistful for catching and preserving "such spirit through the year."

My prayer for us this December is to relax and even enjoy the anticipation of Advent leading to Christmas. Yes, we can't escape the turmoil of our times, but we can take time to focus on our faith and trust in the one who comes to bring peace.

THE CHRISTMAS FUND

It is advent season, time to count our blessings and be thankful for what we have. It is also a great time of the year to pray for and care for those less fortunate.

For over 100 years the UCC Church Christmas Fund has been caring for active and retired clergy and lay employees. The Christmas fund provides emergency grants, small annuities, and health insurance premiums for lower income retirees. Christmas "Thank you gifts" are awarded to retired UCC clergy/lay employees with limited income as a way of saying "thank you" for year of service. Emergency grants are awarded to retirees who face unforeseen circumstances that create financial hardship.

Retirees with limited income may receive monthly payments to bring household income up to a level so they can afford basic needs such and food, utilities and medical expenses.

Christmas fund offering is received December 17, however, donations to the Christmas fund can be placed in the offering at any time using the envelopes from the pews, on line through automatic giving, using our VANCO account or mailed to the church at 515 W. 5th Street, Neillsville.

Thank you for your continued support of the UCC Church "five for five missions" including the Christmas fund. Also thank you everyone for your generous support of our local UCC church.

- The parking lot has been completed satisfactorily.
- A leaf blower has been purchased for use for blowing snow by staff, when possible.
- The roof leaks and gutters will be handled by Miller Home Improvements from Marshfield with Kevin Erickson working with the company.

- Mike Perkl is following up on the installation of a grease trap in the kitchen, along with vacuuming the compressor
 - out to help maintain good cooling in the kitchen refrigerator.
- Looking into our church insurance to see if we have coverage for sewer backup.
- Hap Eddy is following up with Custom Heating to complete the annual evaluation of the heating system.
- The heating vents in the Pastor's Office will be sand blasted and painted.

Christian Education

Stephanie Heck shared the following:

- No meeting has been held.
- They will be meeting next week with Calvary to discuss the Christmas program, with practice starting November 8.
- More children are attending each time they meet; last time there were 78 total children, which is a good problem to have.
- The children sang last Wednesday at Calvary and will be singing this Sunday, October 22 at UCC.
- Our Christmas program will be all our children doing the whole service, including confirmation students.
- A parent confirmation meeting will be held after church school next week at UCC to cover expectations.
- From our church, we have 18 confirmation students in 7th and 8th grades.
- Wednesday, October 25 and Wednesday, November 8 UCC will be hosting J.A.M. and confirmation classes.

Deacons

Karlene Wallace shared the following:

- Not many volunteer letters were returned, but the Deacons will be working on a schedule with those that have responded.
 - There will be no men scheduled during hunting season.
- All Saint's Day is set for Sunday, November 5 with Barb Shoemaker filling the pulpit
 - o Barb Shoemaker has volunteered to fill the pulpit whenever needed for Pastor Sue.
- Communion is set for Sunday, November 12.
- This year with Christmas being on a Sunday, instead of three (3) separate services (10 AM, 4:30 PM, and 7:30 PM), the committee is looking into just two (2) services being held ... 4:30 PM for families with young children and 7:30 PM for the candlelight service.
 - It was suggested that we offer rides for evening Christmas services, for those not able to drive at night. Anyone needing this service should contact the church office.
