*Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. 1 Corinthians 1:3-4*

Dear Friends,

First, let me say a huge thank you to all for the love and support you have lavished upon me and my family in these past few weeks. I genuinely feel wrapped in prayer, buoyed by the warmth of your care and concern. The cards are treasured blessings that I can read and reread over and over, and the gas cards have eased my mind about expenses for family who will be traveling to be with me during upcoming treatment.

As I lay in the hospital bed those first few nights, so many thoughts flooded my mind, but one word kept coming to the forefront: GRACE. Grace, freely given and so undeserved. It's a word we use so often but rarely think about what it really means. We say grace before our meals - a simple blessing thanking God for the gifts provided in abundance. In his book, The Grace of God, Tony Evans defines grace as "the inexhaustible supply of God's goodness whereby He does for us what we could never do for ourselves." He later elaborates, "Grace is cultivated and grows by relationship, not by rules or endless spiritual calisthenics. The deeper our relationship with Christ, the greater the experience of grace and therefore the greater the spiritual growth."

God's grace and mercy are truly without equal and without end. Even in the midst of this life-changing diagnosis, I am learning to recognize the grace that abounds - the fact that God brought me to the beautiful city of Neillsville in just the right timing to get to know and love all of you, dear church family, to be in the right place for the best healthcare with all the support and prayers that you so diligently and faithfully shower on me and my family. I am also learning to have a bit more grace with myself and others, as we never know exactly what battles any person is facing. It is never easy to let myself off the hook for my own perceived failings and deficiencies, but this journey is forcing me to step back and see me as God sees me: human and imperfect but made in God's image and loved exactly as I am, flaws and all - giving myself a little grace.

My wish for you, my friends, is that you will eagerly accept God's grace and give yourself grace when you feel lacking in any way. No matter what challenges we are facing, mentally or physically, with the psalmist, we can sing, "*I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.*"

# HNATIUK FAMILY UPDATE

Mykola and Olesia Hnatiuk with their two boys, Roman and Dmytro have lived on Popple Valley Farm near Unity since January 2023. They fled the war in Ukraine and started a new life as they both found jobs, readily improved their grasp of English and got the boys enrolled in school. Returning to Ukraine in the foreseeable future is not an option. There have been some bumps as they have attempted to extend their visas. Olesia had applied for a two-year extension of their Humanitarian Parole visas for the entire family, but only her application was approved. She refiled for Mykola and the boys. Their applications can be viewed online, but no action has been taken on them.

Mykola worked at the Abbyland Pork Plant in Curtiss in preventive maintenance until his work permit expired January 28, 2025. He got his work authorization reinstated just as the administration put a pause on all applications. His work permit was literally in the mail as that decision was made. He was able to resume working and was hired by Mullin's Cheese in Marshfield. Mykola has a beekeeping hobby with 4 hives last year. This year he bought 20 hives and split them into 40. He has harvested over 1000 pounds of honey.

Olesia left her position as a teacher at Zion Lutheran Early Childhood Center so she could attend classes and begin her clinical training for a nursing degree. Her first clinical assignment is in Portage County where she must travel two days a week over the semester. She has classes in Marshfield three days a week. Olesia continues to work three weekends a month as a CNA at the Clark County Rehabilitation and Living Center in Owen. She will be a kind, dedicated, compassionate nurse if she is able to finish her degree. Olesia will be one semester short in October of 2026 when her work permit is scheduled to expire.

Olesia is researching and studying every possible avenue for the family to remain here after October 2026. Mykola and Olesia both have work authorizations that expire October 19, 2026. Immigrants lose their driver's license and their legal status when their work permit expires. Ukrainian immigrants were awarded Humanitarian Parole status and welcomed into this country only after they and their sponsors were thoroughly vetted. The constant threat of losing their legal status despite efforts to be fully employed, expand their education and contribute to the community is frustrating and frightening for them.

Roman and Dmytro started the school year excited to ride the big yellow bus. The past two years their parents drove them to school, but with Olesia's classes and Mykola's work schedule, they had to make a change. Both boys mastered English and are progressing in school. The family had a large garden again this year. The Hnatiuks remain optimistic and energetic as they face a very uncertain future.

To my church family and friends:

These past few weeks have been a whirlwind, and I'm sure you have lots of questions. I thought it would be best to give everyone a summary of what has been happening with me and where we are going in the future, so we all have the same information. I know how easily facts can get misinterpreted in the well-intentioned passing of information. So here's the whole story:

In mid-September, I started to have some vague symptoms of unease and "brain fog." Nothing specific, no headaches, no sudden acute onset of anything of significance. I was scheduled for my annual physical for the first week of October and intended to discuss symptoms with my primary care provider at that time. As the symptoms progressed, I found myself struggling to focus on conversations at times, and I thought I was possibly dehydrated. Forcing fluids did nothing to improve my "fogginess", and on Sunday, October 5, things started to click for me. I realized that all my issues were on my left side - no pain or obvious weakness, just a kind of disconnect between my brain and my left side and an increasing clumsiness. That morning, I knew that this was more than just dehydration and needed more urgent attention, so I asked Deacons for additional help with worship on that Sunday and my dear husband, Earnie, took me straight to Neillsville Urgent Care after worship service. We were incredibly fortunate that I was the only patient at that moment, and we had prompt and thorough attention with an immediate CT scan that quickly identified the brain tumor. The staff facilitated a transfer to Marshfield ER by private vehicle, and I was quickly admitted and soon in the MRI machine. When I returned to my ER room, the neurosurgeon (Dr. Awe) was already there waiting for me.

The MRI identified the brain tumor as glioblastoma (GBM), the same brain cancer that my dad had. Because we had been through this journey with Dad, I was well aware of the next steps, risks and benefits. Dr. Awe scheduled surgery for the very next day. All of our family gathered in Marshfield. I spent one night in ICU following surgery, which went very well. We know that they did not get all the cancer, because it is truly impossible with GBM; the surgeon gets as much as they safely can remove without causing further brain damage, and we trust the radiation to address the remaining cells. The pathology results during surgery confirmed that this is glioblastoma multiforme.

Following surgery, I was admitted to the Rehab Unit on 5 West at Marshfield Clinic - I cannot say enough good things about this unit! The staff, from nurses to doctors to therapists and even cleaning crews and food services, were simply all amazing! I have no doubt I would have bounced back from surgery, but the rehab staff made that recovery much more complete and gave me confidence that I desperately needed. I did not have any major deficiencies after surgery, but the therapy gave me tools to better organize my thoughts, regain strength and balance and prepare for the future journey ahead. They educated me and Earnie on how to do things safer and what to expect when the disease progresses in the future. We are well set up now for whatever the future may hold.

For now, my focus is on the next steps of treatment: As I write this letter, I am expecting to start 6 weeks of radiation treatment (hopefully October 30) concurrent with oral chemotherapy. I fully intend to be back in worship with you for Advent and Christmas - the start of a brand new church year, which feels extra-significant this year. We know the statistics for glioblastoma survival rates, but we are also well aware that there is constant research happening, and people are beating the odds all the time. I am still young enough and overall healthy enough to be one of the longer term survivors. We will continue to pursue treatments as long as it continues to offer a good quality of life. My daily prayer and focus for all decisions is: Let me count the life in my days, not the days in my life. I promise to be open and honest with all of you as we go forward through this journey together, and I hope you will continue to be open and honest with me as well. We are a family, and I am grateful that each of you are in my life. With much love and gratitude,


